# **Denton moves forward with** protesting proposed sewer plant for a lagoon community in Sanger

"So most of these smaller regional plants are designed for specific developments and most of them are able to stay under that 1 million gallon daily rate, which negates their responsibility to mitigate the impact of introducing the [discharged] water into the watershed," Kyle Pedigo, planning and division manager for water utilities, told Denton City Council members during their meeting Tuesday.

The council directed with an ordinance that will grant the city manager or their designee (i.e. the water utilities department) the ability to file protests against permit applications for sewer plants withand out council approval.
