Six-lane freeway connecting I-35 with Dallas North Tollway

Public Scoping Meetings to be held October 29-30

Denton County in partnership with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) is initiating an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) to construct a six-lane freeway primarily on new location connecting I-35 in Denton County, Texas with the Dallas North Tollway in Collin County, Texas.

Denton County is hosting a series of in-person and virtual public scoping meetings to share information about the environmental review process and alternatives under consideration and gather feedback from the public. Materials presented will be the same at each public scoping meeting. One of the proposed paths could be connecting to I-35 from Milam Road, just south of Sanger.

The in-person public scoping meetings will follow an open house format where the public may come and go at their convenience. Staff will be available to answer questions and take comments.

The purpose of the proposed action is to address population and travel demand growth and support safe and resilient east-west mobility and connectivity across Denton County. The need for the proposed action is driven by (a) rapid population growth and increasing traffic volumes that are contributing to congestion, (b) higher crash rates along Study Area roadways compared to the statewide average, and (c) limited mobility due to the lack of contiguous east-west arterials.

Ultimately, this study will allow Denton County to preserve the land needed for the corridor to protect it from future development. Transportation projects require years of advanced planning and development, which is why the county must plan now for the growth it expects in the next 30 years.



He had several things that he loved to do...cooking, hunting, being outdoors and football games. Those who knew him will miss him dearly. Benny often


rode around the neighborhood on his golf cart visiting neighbors and meeting new homeowners and making friends. He was a friendly man who loved to tell stories.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANGER, DENTON COUNTY, TEXAS, AMENDING THE CITY OF SANGER CODE OF ORDINANCE, CHAPTER 5 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES, ARTICLE 5.200 INTERNATIONAL FIRE CODE, PROVIDING FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT; PROVIDING A CUMULATIVE CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A PENALTY OR FINE IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 1.109 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCE FOR VIOLATIONS; AND PROVIDING A SAVINGS CLAUSE; AUTHORIZING PUBLICATION; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. 



Dear Friends,

Lately, we have had several complaints that the rules and regulations the Sanger Cemetery Association has set forth are not being followed. These complaints are not regarding the cemetery's upkeep but the objects placed at the gravesites. Each spring, we send letters notifying you when Decoration Day will be held. In that letter, the rules and regulations of the cemetery are displayed with the heading, "PLEASE READ CAREFULLY." This list is also included in the deed you received when you purchased your spaces, a sign just inside the cemetery gate, and displayed at the bottom of this letter. There is no excuse for the blatant disregard of these rules. The previous caretaker had been permitted to remove objects that obstructed his mowing and other duties, which aggravated those leaving these objects, compounding the problem further.

Decorative items may not be secured or adhered to monuments at any time; such items will be removed by the caretaker or a member of the Board. Floral saddles, wreath holders, and vases matching the material of the monuments are acceptable.

Effective immediately, the Board of Directors is asking for you to remove ALL objects from the gravesites that do not permanently mark the identity of that grave or that have not been previously approved by the Board of Directors. These objects include but are not limited to all trinkets, marbles, breakable objects of any nature, arches (wood, metal, or pipe), shepherd's hooks, benches (unless it is the actual monument with the name engraved on it. At which point, the material must be of granite or bronze), vigil lights, chimes, flower pots, trees or shrubs or any statue that is not a part of the monument. Most importantly, no open-flame candles are permitted. These are not an option! We have noticed some burnt grass from candles. Two families sought and were granted permission from the previous Board years ago to place a bench in their spaces in the cemetery. One family has taken their benches down; the other will remain until it becomes a hazard.

You will have until November 15, 2024, to remove said items. If you choose not to remove items by this date, the Board of Directors will have them removed and placed in a designated dumpster at the cemetery's North end, where they will remain for another two weeks. Once items are in the dumpster, we cannot guarantee that you will receive them back. After this clean-up, items placed around the gravesites will be removed without notification.

Floral arrangements accompanying the casket or urn at the time of burial will be placed on the completed grave. If you place flowers at the gravesite and bring new flowers, please remove the old ones. Flowers should be placed either in the vases on your monument or in a saddle placed directly on the top. If there are no vases on the memorial, flowers may be placed in a temporary vase on the ground directly in front of the monument. If the flowers become faded or unsightly, they may be removed before you have a chance to replace them. Please do not line the perimeter of the grave with anything, as this obstructs the mowing. The caretaker has the right to remove items without notification.

All graves must be marked with a monument constructed of granite or bronze. Each monument must sit on an exposed concrete base four inches thick and a 3" apron in circumference. You may not fabricate these memorials of metal, and the Board must approve all monuments. Before a monument is placed, the company or person setting it must contact Coker Funeral Home at (940) 458-3311 to ensure its placement in the proper space.

Additionally, we have received significant complaints that some groups are hanging out, drinking beer, and leaving full or empty beer bottles to surround the grave. The cemetery is not the place for that behavior, nor will it be tolerated.

Please note that Coker Funeral Home does not own this cemetery or receive monetary compensation. They merely volunteer as the liaison for the Sanger Cemetery Association.

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

We appreciate your continued cooperation in upholding the cemetery's conditions and regulations, which are listed below. Your cooperation aids in reducing the amount of maintenance required by the caretaker and allows him to keep the grounds in better condition.

Conditions and Regulations of the Sanger Cemetery

- 1. The tract conveyed shall be for the burial of the human dead and no other use.
- The tract conveyed shall not be curbed or enclosed in any manner. Any existing curb that has deteriorated or is damaged cannot be repaired and should be removed. The cemetery board has the authority to remove any such curbing
- 3. No glass containers shall be left within the boundaries of the cemetery.
- No trees, shrubs, ornamental statuary, or other items that would be an obstruction to mowing shall be established on any tracts.
- The use of the tract conveyed shall be subject to the rules and regulations of the Sanger Cemetery Association, as they presently stand or are later amended.
- The association requires that a permanent marker be placed on the grave as soon as possible after burial. These memorials should only be made of granite or bronze and must sit on an exposed concrete had four inches thick with a three-inch apron. The association must be no BEFORE such memorials are set. Please contact (940) 458-3311 for the requirements of placing a monument in the cemetery.

We have a beautiful cemetery, and the upkeep is costly. The congestion of the items in the cemetery keeps the caretakers from doing their job effectively, making our cemetery look unkept and dirty. We need to return it to a place of quiet rest for family and friends to visit and reflect on the memories of their loved ones. This reflection cannot happen with clutter lying around. We would appreciate your help in abiding by the rules set forth to make this such a place. The gates will open at 7 am and close at dusk (basically, sunrise to sunset) to deter vandalism in the cemetery.
