
# **Sanger Crossing Development underway** RIDGEMONT ONSTRUCTION SI

## Tom Thumb will be the anchor of the retail project

Excavation has started for the Sanger Crossing Development. This major retail addition will be located at the southeast corner of FM 455 and I-35 within the Sanger Crossing Retail Development, developed by Malouf Interests. The anchor of the retail project is Tom Thumb and is anticipated to be complete by the end of 2025.

The I-35 and FM 455 expansions created a food desert after the Super Save grocery store was demolished in 2021. Tom Thumb's 50,000-squarefoot grocery store will include a pharmacy and drive-thru service window and departments for fresh produce, deli, bakery, meat, seafood, floral

In addition to the grocery store, the Sanger Crossing development will include 582 multifamily units, 18 town homes, 12 duplex units, 296 single residential units and 18 commercial lots.

## **Great voter turnout in Sanger Precincts**

Sanger registered voters had a great turnout at the polling locations in the November 5 General Election with 8,444 voters casting ballots in the five main precints. There are 12,031 registered voters in these precincts with a 70.15% turnout. See the breakdown to the right. At the early voting location at the Sanger Community Center there were 6,337 people who voted in 12 days. Note: not all the early votes are from the five main Sanger precincts.

In a local race, Denton County Sheriff Tracy Murphree won a third term despite Democrat Fredrick Bishop's effort to unseat him. Official results reported by the county elections administration Tuesday night showed 249,138 votes, or about 60%, for Murphree and 163,566 for Bishop, with all precincts reporting.

Murphree, of Sanger, first won the county's highest law enforcement office in 2016 and was reelected in 2020.

He secured sizable wins against opponents Randy Butler in 2016, when Murphree won with 79.8% of the vote, and write-in candidate Freya Odinsdottir in 2020, when the sheriff was reelected with 94.3% of the vote.

Hailing from Yoakum County, Murphree has previously worked at the Texas Department of Public Safety as a Texas Ranger in Denton County and was a captain of the criminal investigation division for the Denton County Sheriff's Office.

A former Dallas police officer, Bishop was born and raised in Denton County. He served in the U.S. Army and is in the reserve, worked as a jailer for the Dallas County Sheriff's Department and retired from the Dallas Police Department as a detective. He teaches law enforcement at Little Elm High School.



## **Bolivar Masonic Lodge donates \$11,100**



## Sanger Historical Society to hold public meeting at Sanger Public Library

The Sanger Area Historical Society, in conjunction with the Sanger Public Library, will hold a public meeting for the community November 7, 2024, at 6:30 p.m. at the Sanger Public Library meeting room.

Guest author, Thomas O. McDonald, historian and author of "Texas Rangers, Ranchers, and Realtors" will speak about the James Hughes Callahan and Day Families of the Guadalupe River Basin.

Callahan was a native Georgian and migrated to Texas to serve in the Texas Revolution in exchange for land. Callahan was a Texas Ranger, a soldier, a rancher, and a land developer and at every turn was making his mark on the evolving Guadalupe River Basin. His wife, Sarah, and her family's journey reflected the experience of many immigrants to Texas after its war of independence. McDonald traces the pair's respective paths to their meeting as they contend with conflict, troublesome social mores, and the emergence of new industries along with helping to shape the Texas culture.



Lately I've been thinking about our government. Those of you who were in school prior to the 1970s probably had Civics in some shape, form or fashion. I graduated in 1962 and had as requirements for my graduation a class in American Civics in addition to a class in Texas Civics. I'm not talking about history class I am speaking of classes which taught the establishment, theory, practice and laws of the United States of America and the State of Texas. Two separate classes and if I remember correctly each a semester long. Lately the media, politicians and just everyday people have been throwing out what they consider facts about our government. Unfortunately, much misinformation (I didn't say lies I said misinformation) has been put forth as solid and concrete fact. That is what my thoughts have been about lately. Probably this topic is a logical follow to my concern about true communication. Warning I am NOT going to talk politics here, I am not going to talk party platforms, I am not going to talk candidates for or elected officials in office. I don't think I will even attempt to address the entire Constitution. What I am going to attempt is a clarification of just what the Constitution is, what it is for, what does it mean. To be more clear maybe I should say that what I am going for here is just to determine what the 4,543 words that make up this Constitution is communicating. On second thought that is a lot of words so let me trim it down a bit and just start with the Preamble which is a mere 52 words. Now that is a good place to start, the

beginning. To refresh your memory here are those 52 words that some of us were required to memorize: We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union, establish Justice, ensure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defense, [sic], promote the general Welings of Liberty to ourselves and establish this Constitution for the United States of America.

Just how should we break this down? First take note that several words are capitalized and given special emphasis. People, Order, Union, Justice, Tranquility, Welfare, Blessings, Liberty, Posterity, Constitution are all capitalized but, in most cases, not because of any grammatical rule. Look at the words. Are those upper-case letters adding to the meaning of what is being said? Keep that question in mind as we continue.

We the People of the

United States. We, begins the sentence and thus is capitalized. Oh, but this says We the People. Generally, people can designate a collection of human beings. But taking it further

it can also refer to a community, a nation or an ethnic group. So, we have a good reason to capitalize People as it is followed by the prepositional phrase 'of the United States' and designates a special group set apart by geographical location. Hey this isn't so bad. Let's keep going and take a phrase which has two such capitalized words.

We the People of the United States, in Order to form a more perfect Union. People can be arranged in order, like in a particular pattern or in relation or maybe even sequence. The People here have a connection of some sort and because we know what this document is we knows that they have a common goal. Order is capitalized to emphasize the depth of importance that forming this Union has. And, not just a Union but a more perfect Union. As you can see there is a difference between perfect union and perfect Union. Think about

How do you form a more perfect Union. I read it this way, those capitalized words following more perfect Union look to be the foundation and basis for a union to be made more Perfect. Or, in other words, for our union to be more perfect there are several things which we must do: establish make up the nation. Now, Justice, ensure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defense (sic), promote the general Welfare, and secure the Blessings of Liberty. At this point it looks as though there is a rough sketch of a blueprint for what the founding fathers were attempting to build. Why don't we take each one of the 'building blocks' they saw fit to capitalize and see if we can determine the why. The why these are needed for a more perfect Union.

There are four major foundational blocks: Justice; Tranquility; Welfare; Blessings of Liberty. All capitalized and all with modifiers etc. Is the order that they are presented important to note? Let's ask the question then: Can Tranquility, Welfare and Liberty truly exist if Justice is not established? When they wrote this there was not an active democracy on earth (at least it appears so in historical record). They wanted to establish a Union

that would provide Justice.

Establish Justice, a good first step but why list Tranquility as the next "stone"? Common sense will tell us all that sometimes Justice is not accompanied by Tranquility. They are not always companions. While domestic can refer to home and family it also can refer to a nation or country. Here I believe they, our founders, were referring to both because what is going on in a nation will of course have impact on the family. So they felt that it was important to have domestic (note not capitalized) Tranquility. I think by capitalizing Tranquility they were emphasizing that what was needed was a Union which presented its inhabitants with a calm, stable environment. Safe to say here that providing for the common defense would be an integral need for true peace/ tranquility. Remember these men had experienced situations where defense was necessary (other countries wanting land, native Americans defending land, etc.) Peace was not guaranteed. Thus, Tranquility is capitalized because of its essentialness. To have a more Perfect Union we must have Tranquility (personal peace, family peace, national peace).

Now we come to one that is a bit more challenging, general Welfare. Dictionary definition of this term opens up the possibilities because the reference would be to the happiness, fortunes and health of both the individual and the collection of individuals which would the building block widens the responsibility of the governing body to take care of health, happiness and fortunes of its members. It is intimidating to be the head of the family and take on your shoulders their health, happiness and fortunes. Taking on this task for a nation of people would be daunting to say the least. To put it more down to earth it would be absolutely scary. Our founders in their drive to form a more perfect Union knew that it was extremely important to have general Welfare as one of the basic tenets. They, in the body of the Constitution and the Bill of Rights, diligently strove to provide this building block as well as the

Now we come to a phrase, Blessings of Liberty, which will speak differently interpretation of the words. Blessing can be simply defined as God's favor and protection. Then, the definition of Liberty: "the state of being free within society from oppressive restrictions imposed by authority on one's way of life, behavior, stated definition of Liber-

scope to act as one pleases." The first and most involved definition is the one I think the founders intentioned. The second and shorter is the one that far too many people today use as their definition when applied to themselves not others LOL. For example, it is ok for me to call you whatever name I want but you do not have the same liberty. But I digress. Basic knowledge of the founders shows us a wide range of beliefs. There was no one consensus other than they had faith in a higher power and believed that this higher power granted or blessed. It can be eas-

ily seen how important they

saw these Blessings because

they capitalized the word.

the essential Liberty.

What they did was give four essential building blocks: Justice; Tranquility; Welfare; Blessings of Liberty. Or stated differently, they wanted to give the people of the United States a government which would provide a climate which was fair and morally correct, a government which provided the personal and family peace as well as national peace. In addition, the governing body would be concerned with the fortunes, health and happiness of its citizens. Justice, Tranquility and Welfare were completed with God's granting the people the rights of freedom, the freedom from authority which could be oppressive Then they connected it to and restricting. Through the

Blessings of God, Liberty could be attained.

The closing of the Preamble is a fitting way to end the introduction to what the founders were establishing/creating. In their 52 words they not only used proper writing technique by providing an introductory statement about where they were going with this document, they also gave us insight into what must have been their aim. The closing to the Preamble reflects their plans/hopes/dreams for this nation they were founding, this new form of government. They gave us the essentials it would take to do this formation, placed it directly in the hands of



## Indians football needs to beat Farmersville to get in playoffs

A relentless rushing effort fueled Sanger's 53-14 win last Friday against Gainesville.

Junior running back Reggie Jones, who entered the game leading all local running backs with 1,277 rushing yards and 12 rushing touchdowns, added three more scores by the end of the night.

His backfield partner, senior running back Luke Thompson, a Drake commit, added two touchdowns of his own. The duo served as the driving force in the Indians' onslaught on the ground with six total rushing touchdowns.

Sanger quarterback Reed Sebastian was 6-11 for 122 yards passing and completed a 66-yard touchdown to Joel Rodriguez. (3 catches, 93 yards) Austin Martin had a 65 yard touchdown run. He finished the night 7-161 yards to lead the Sanger rushing attack.

The ground assault by Sanger (4-5, 3-2 in district) began on its opening drive as it marched down the field and called three consecutive handoffs in the red zone.

Gainesville later scored on a 12-yard touchdown pass over the middle.

The Indians returned to the end zone quickly. During the Leopards' point-after try, junior cornerback Jaise Jackson ran unblocked and deflected the kick. Senior cornerback Cameron Hayes then scooped the ball up and returned it all the way for a 2-point conversion. It was all Sanger after that.

On defense, Blake Monden led the Indians defense with 9 tackles, 1 sack and one tackle for a loss; Cameron Hayes and Abimbola Ogunwuyi each had an interception. See defensive standouts on this page:

Winning this district matchup moves Sanger in po sition to secure a playoff spot with a win at Farmerville (6-3, 3-2) Friday. The Indians could finish as high as second in the district with a win and either Krum beating Bonham or Caddo Mills losing to Van Alstyne.
