## Denton County opens Multi-Agency Resource Center and Disaster Recovery Center in Sanger for individuals affected by recent storms

The Denton County Office of Emergency Management, in conjunction with FEMA and area non-profit organizations, will be providing services to all Denton County residents affected by the recent rounds of storms at a Multi-Agency Resource Center (MARC)/Disaster Recovery Center (DRC) in Sanger.

The MARC/DRC will be located at Butterfield Elementary School at 291 Indian Lane, Sanger 76266, which is within the Sanger Independent School District. The MARC center will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. beginning Wednesday, June 5, 2024. Hours of operation will be reviewed after Wednesday based on need.

At the MARC/DRC, affected residents will be able to receive assistance in filing disaster claims with FEMA, the Small Business Loan Administration (SBA), as well as with other non-profit agencies that provide several services. Individuals impacted by storms starting May 25 through today can apply for assistance.

The MARC/DRC will be staffed with individuals from area agencies

- including the Salvation Army, Red Cross, and others - to assist residents with their needs.

United Way of Denton County, which opened a disaster relief donation fund to help residents affected by the tornadoes, reports as of early on June 4, the account has 160 donors who have pledged just more than \$44,000. Those funds will be utilized to assist residents as needed over and above what they may receive through FEMA and TDEM iSTAT applications.

For instance, an individual may need prescription eyeglasses that were damaged in the tornado, or assistance with replacing medications. The funds will be allocated up to \$1,500 per household.

On Tuesday, Denton County Commissioners Court extended the Disaster Declaration for one week and approved a mutual aid agreement between Sanger Independent School District and Denton County to operate the Butterfield Elementary

Gymnasium for use in recovery efforts associated with the EF-1 Sanger and Pilot Point tornadoes and the hurricane force winds the following week.

A vigil service was held at the Downtown Sanger Park Square for 2-year-old Essence McCrary and her brother 5-year-old Tyrique McCrary. Their 12-year-old sister Zamiya is a student at Sixth Grade Center in Sanger. She was babysitting her siblings when her mother left to go pick up her husband from work before their home was swept off its foundation from the tornadoes last week, near Lone Oak Road, just north of Sanger. Tyrique's 6th birthday is June 7.

Zamiya survived, but, is still in the hospital after surgery and in physical therapy. She had spinal and wrist surgery. She also suffered a punctured lung and four broken ribs. She is still healing and might be released from the hospital next week. Three others survived. Her two brothers Jacobi (age 5) and Geo (age 2) were released from the hospital the day after the tornado. Her cousin Baby Harper (age 2) got out of the hospital three days later. According to a family member, Jacobi held on to Geo and Harper, standing in a pond, until help came.

*Note: The Sportsman and Sportsman 2 have the same ownership. The Sportsman 2 at 2040 N. Stemmons / Lois Road has released a statement with the Sanger News and posting on Facebook this week. They wanted to clarify why the doors were locked on the night of the tornadoes.*

First off, our condolences to the individuals affected by the tornado storm, recently. Our hearts go out to each and everyone of you! To all the first responders, police officers, firefighters, Salvation Army members, national guard, and anybody else who has been giving their time and efforts to help those in this moment of tragedy, we thank you and we salute you!

Over the past week, rumors and gossip about our store (Sportsman 2) on the night of the storm have been circulating. We've seen members of our community attack our characters and efforts. We understand this is a tough time for this town and our neighboring communities. We've been trying to ignore the negativity and focus on helping those affected in anyway we can.

## Public Notice OWS System



There are four outdoor weather sirens within the Sanger City limits. On 5-21-2024, two of those OWS sirens were functioning (located at McClains and Wagon Master), and two were not. The OWS at Porter Park had been broken into, and a radio stolen from it. The OWS at Wagon Master was struck by lightning and failed to respond to the daily computer polling of the devices. After severe storms covered a large portion of Denton County on Tuesday morning, another OWS received damage. That leaves only one OWS currently working (McClains). Repairs have been requested, but it will take some time.

While Outdoor Warning Sirens are one way to receive notice of impending danger, they are only designed to be heard if you are outside of your residence. The Outdoor Warning Systems are known by many as "tornado sirens" or just "sirens." However, it is important to understand that the Outdoor Warning System is designed for all hazards. As the name implies, the system is designed for people that are outdoors. Those who are indoors may not be able to hear the OWS for various reasons (radio or television is on, vacuum cleaner going, etc.). The OWS should only be used as a supplemental warning tool for individuals. OWS can be used to alert citizens of tornadoes, hail, hazardous material inci-

dents, civil emergencies, and any other impending hazard that could adversely affect the lives and property in the general vicinity. When an Outdoor Warning System is activated, remain calm and go to a safe shelter indoors. Then, tune into your NOAA All Hazards Radio, local television, or radio for further instructions. Remain indoors until the emergency has ended.

The SANGER FIRE DEPARTMENT encourages the use of any of the following notification forms:

**MOBILE APPS WITH LOCAL ALERT FUNCTIONS**

**FEMA APP:** Stay updated with severe weather alerts from the National Weather Service for up to five locations across the U.S.; learn how to stay safe before, during, and after over 20 types of hazards; save a custom list of the items in your family's emergency kit; and locate and receive driving directions to open shelters and disaster recovery centers. Using the Disaster Reporter feature, you can also submit disaster-related photos to a public map. The FEMA App is also available in Spanish. Download the app to your mobile device or smartphone free on iTunes or Google Play. Learn more at [www.fema.gov/mobile-app](http://www.fema.gov/mobile-app).

**AMERICAN RED CROSS APP:** The Red Cross Emergency app combines more than 35 different types of severe weather and emergency alerts. You can choose the alerts that are important to your location or the location of loved ones. The "Family Safe" feature allows you to notify loved ones that an alert has been issued in their area and check to see if they are safe. The app also of-

fers information on what to do before, during, and after severe weather hits and how to find open Red Cross Shelters. All content is also available in Spanish. You can download the app to your mobile device or smartphone free on iTunes (Apple-iOS 6.0 or later) and Google Play (Android). Learn more at [www.redcross.org/prepare/mobile-apps](http://www.redcross.org/prepare/mobile-apps).

**THE WEATHER CHANNEL APP:** Tracks weather, provides local forecasts, and pushes alerts of severe weather to your mobile device. The app can be downloaded free on iTunes (Apple iOS 6.0 or later), Google Play (Android), App World (BlackBerry), and Windows Phone at [www.weather.com/apps](http://www.weather.com/apps).

**DENTON COUNTY ALERTS:** Please sign up for Denton County Alerts to receive timely and critical messages to your choice of communications methods, including landline, cellular, text, E-mail, and TTY devices. Do not rely on social media as your only source of critical information. The Denton County FIPS Code for your radio is 48121.

**NOAA ALL HAZARDS RADIO:** NOAA Weather Radio All Hazards (NWR) is a nationwide network of radio stations broadcasting continuous weather information directly from the nearest National Weather Service office. NWR broadcasts official Weather Service warnings, watches, forecasts, and other hazardous information 24 hours a day, seven days a week. [www.weather.gov/nwr](http://www.weather.gov/nwr)

**WAPP APP:** Dallas FTW Weather: Live Interactive Radar, Storm watches & warnings, hourly forecasts, 10-day outlook, closings, and more—all on FOX 4's FREE Weather App.

## Former Sanger police sergeant Cole Thompson makes plea deal

A former Sanger police sergeant pleaded guilty to one count of official oppression, recently. A judge dismissed his assault charge as part of a plea bargain.

Cole Thompson, 37, was sentenced to one year of community supervision with 30 hours of community service.

"It came to the point where after nearly two years I was tired of fighting something that shouldn't have ever happened," Thompson told the Denton Record-Chronicle via email Thursday. "I am glad it's over and I can move on with my life for my family's sake." Thompson

was indicted on the two misdemeanor charges in April 2023. The indictment accused Thompson of using excessive force to arrest a man after a domestic disturbance call in October 2022.

After an internal investigation, Thompson was terminated from the department on Dec. 9, 2022.

Thompson spoke out against the former Sanger police chief, Waylan Rhodes, accusing the former chief of retaliating against him for exposing alleged sexual misconduct.

Rhodes resigned without notice on May 12, 2023, stating that leading

the department was unusually difficult because some personnel were resistant to the administrative and culture changes he wanted to make.

When Thompson was indicted on the two charges, he initially intended to go to trial, which was set for June 24.

However, on May 22, Thompson struck a plea bargain and pleaded guilty to the Class A misdemeanor official oppression charge.

As part of the plea agreement, 16th District Court Judge Sherry Shipman dismissed the Class A misdemeanor assault charge.

blings entitled "Sunny's Thoughts" than to write about thoughts. Believe it or not, there is not much thinking going on. And yes I know I've ended with a preposition just ignore because these are ramblings. Now, back to the word think. Yes, we think about what we are going to have for lunch or whether or not we need to turn left or right to get to where we are going. But actually that is not true thought, that is just making decisions, mostly minor, about moment-to-moment or day-to-day things. The thought I am referring to is deeper, more serious.

When deep and serious thoughts are mentioned topics that rise to the surface would most likely include politics, religion, world situation, etc. That is not the 'thoughts' to which I am referring. Thoughts that come to me in the still of the night, the thoughts that pop up when I am working on some task that needs little focus. These thoughts range from the curiosity about why driver's don't follow

traffic laws to the freedom of choice we are given by God, to the way people treat each other, their pets, their family. We could even go on and on with explanations, but I know that you get where I am going with this.

Finally, we get to what Sunny's Thoughts are about today and that is kindness. The word kindness should also bring to mind the elements or qualities which make up kindness: friendly, generous, gentle, caring, helpful and considerate. If you are kind then you are considerate. If you are considerate then you would not want to cause inconvenience or hurt. Someone kind would want to share time, resources, whatever. A kind person would be friendly and pleasant. When I began my thought trek about being kind all of those words and more popped into my mind. Being truly kind is an extremely daunting thing! How could anyone be a reflector of all of the qualities of kindness? Let me tell you a story of how I began my path to being more kind.

Several years ago I made a decision that every day I would say something to someone that was kind. Not the usual polite phrases like 'have a nice day' or 'take care'. I even determined I would do this to strangers as well as people I knew. Just think, how hard could it be to say something kind, one little thing to one person. When you think about it there is a world full of people to which we can show kindness: sales people, attendants at gas stations, students, fellow workers, people in elevators, etc. It didn't take long for me to realize that this was much more than a project that was a 'check list' sort of thing. I could not just say to myself 'well that is my kind deed for the day' and then move on with whatever else was on my plate. Soon I found myself complimenting a sales person for how they dealt with a difficult customer, stopping in a hospital corridor and asking a crying person if I could pray for them or was there something I could do for them, letting a car pull ahead of me, complimenting someone on their smile or what they were wearing. Before I knew it, it was not a checklist project at all, it was part of me and my way of going through each day. I'm not boasting here or trying to convince you that I am wonderful, perfect and totally kind. Because, truth being told I am just like every human I am flawed and far, far from perfect. If I am not trying to impress with my perfectness, LOL, then what am I trying to accomplish?

That day when I made that plan to just say one kind thing to one person every day I did something that I could never have imagined. It changed everything. It changed every part of my life bit by bit. It changed the way I looked at the world and the people in it and it certainly gave me an opportunity to step back and view myself with more clarity.

I couldn't always see the result of my moment of kindness but sometimes I could. The salesperson who straightened her shoulders and greeted the next customer with a smile, the driver who waved a thank you, the student whose step was a bit more confident. Just think of all of the results that I couldn't see. Even more important than the direct results of being kind I found that kindness to someone encourages them to be kind. Did my decision change the world?

Did me being kind cause an absolute flood of kindness? Who is to say. All I know is that it made my world a better place. Interesting, isn't it what we are told in Matthews 7:12 "In everything, do to others what you would have them do to you." Define kindness, goodness, generosity or any of those attributes which make up kindness however you like, but I think we can draw a conclusion here that if each of us could use this verse from Matthew as a guide then our immediate world would be a better and kind place in which to live. I challenge you here to step out and be kind to everyone, even when they are not kind to you, even when you don't feel like being kind. Take kindness with you everywhere you go!

Those are Sunny's Thoughts for today. I'll share some more with you another time. Have a blessed and certainly a kind day.

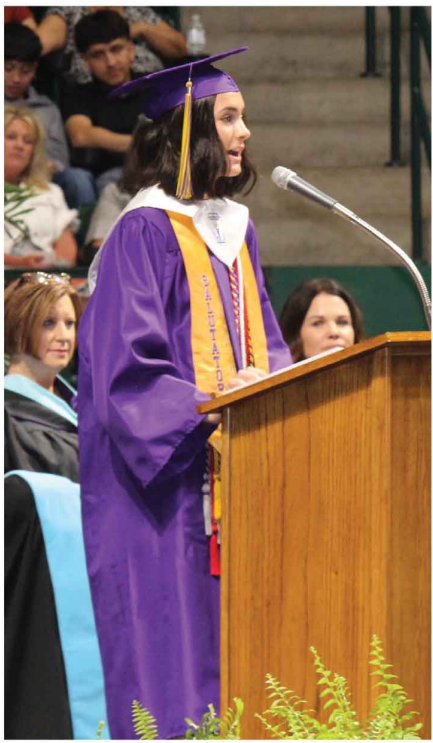

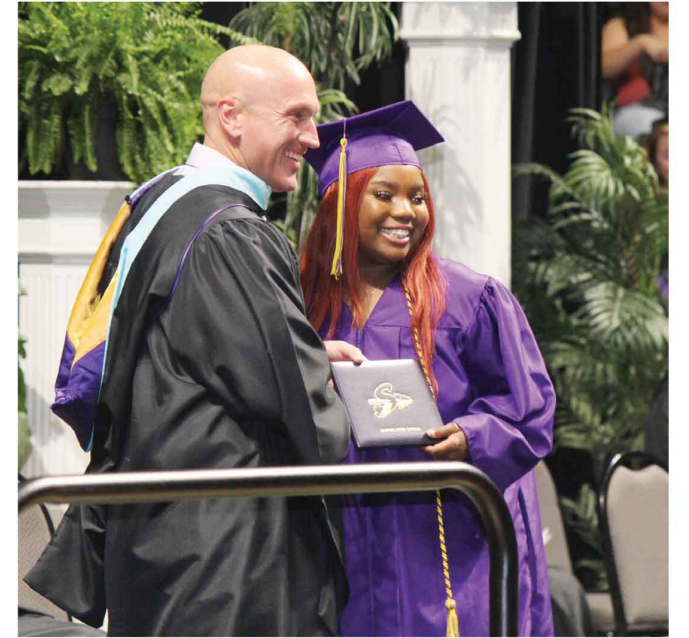

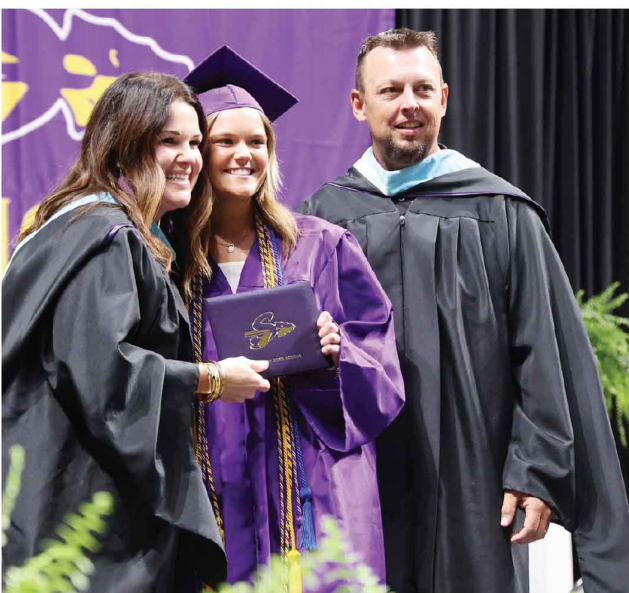

# Lady Indians softball fall to eventual state champion

A four-run barrage in the second inning pushed Calallen to a decisive 8-1 win against Sanger in the Class 4A state semifinals at Red & Charline McCombs Field in Austin last Thursday.

The Wildcats led 5-0 before the Indians recorded their first hit as Jordyn Thibodeaux scattered five hits and walked three.

Calallen, playing in its fourth UIL State Tournament since 2019, and last year's Class 4A state champions, looked comfortable from the outset, when they plated a run in their first at-bat.

But it was the second that dealt the biggest blow. Already staked to a 1-0 lead, Calallen built its lead with a four-spot in the second, taking advantage of walks as Sanger starting pitcher Laela Kloewer issued four walks in the frame.

Meador lined a shot up the middle to score two and Mia Flores singled to right, plating two more. The experienced Wildcats put Sanger in a bind and a 5-0 hole after two. The Indians were making their first appearance at state since winning a title in 2001.

Sanger made a habit of rallying from behind during its softball playoff run.

The Lady Indians trailed at least once in eight of their 12 playoff

games and came back to win six of those contests on their way to the Class 4A state semifinal game against Corpus Christi Calallen.

Sanger found itself down early again versus Calallen but was unable to turn the tide this time as it took an 8-1 loss.

The defeat brought an end to a historic season for Sanger, which won its first outright district championship since 2014 and made just its second state tournament appearance in program history after winning the 3A title in 2001.

"It's been a great ride this year," Kloewer said. "The girls, they're amazing. They truly are. Unselfish girls, and they're here for each other. It's going to hurt for a while, but I'm so proud of them for making it this far and coming out here and really giving it their all."

"At the end of the day, sometimes a team's better than you. They were better than we were today."

Sanger got its first strong opportunity in the top of the third as Lily Wilson hit a two-out single to left field, and MaKynna Meeks drew a walk. The pair advanced to second and third on a double steal, but a fielder's choice ground ball led to Meeks being tagged out and ended the inning with no runs.

The frame was one of a few where the Lady

Indians had some opportunities, whether from baserunners or hard hits, but they were unable to capitalize as Calallen's Jordyn Thibodeaux spun a complete-game effort in the circle.

Playing in her third state tournament, senior Megan Geyer set the table for Alaunah Almaraz in the first inning, scoring the game's first run and added an RBI single in the fourth inning and a two-run double in the sixth, finishing 3 for 4.

Calallen finished with eight runs on nine hits and could have added more, leaving eight runners on, including the bases loaded in the fourth, an inning when Brookelynn Meador, Geyer and Audryna Almaraz all had hits.

The younger Almaraz smoked a ball down the third base line to bring the sixth run of the game home.

Thibodeaux, Calallen's sophomore starting pitcher, struck out eight and improved to 20-1 on the season and was dominant in the semifinals for the second straight season.

Sanger's lone run came in the sixth inning. Abby Chapmond doubled off the wall in straight away center field to score pinch runner Harley Miller.

Although Sanger saw its season come to an end with the loss, the program



hopes it can build on the successes of 2024 going forward.

Sanger graduates three of its 10 typical starters in MaKynna Meeks, Samantha Hydock and Piper Lindlau along with fellow senior Emily Wells but is slated to bring back many other key contributors. The Lady Indians' state tournament roster featured five freshmen, three of whom started, and plenty of other underclassmen helped lead the way.

Toby Kloewer hopes the bitter end can serve as motivation for those players heading into the 2025 campaign.

The heavyweight third installment of Calallen and Liberty in the Class 4A softball state championship lived up to its billing.

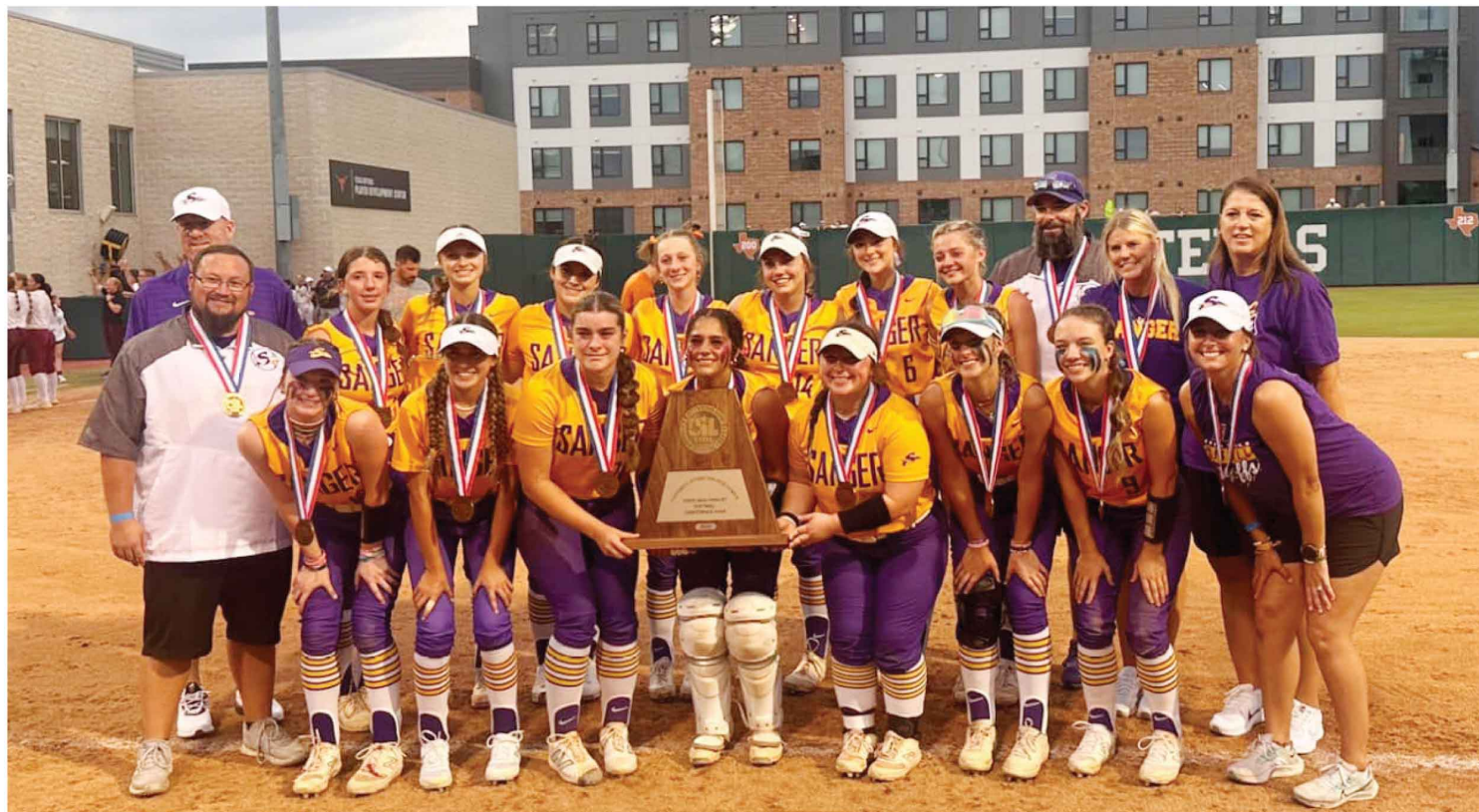
Calallen and Liberty combined to win the last three state titles and had four losses this season between them.

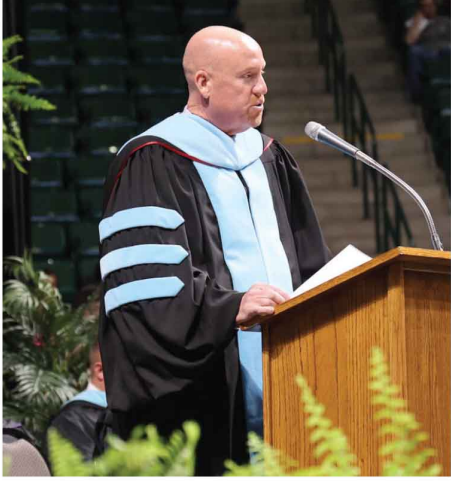
