


#### Jimmy Burt Vaughn

August 15, 1948 - February 13, 2024

Jimmy Burt Vaughn, 75, went to be with Jesus on Tuesday, February 13, 2024, surrounded by his family at his home in Gainesville, Texas. Although his family grieves the loss of their loved one, they find peace knowing it was a joyous day in heaven

Knowing he had found his niche, Jimmy decided to hone his talent as the owner of Vaughn Inspections, an independent inspection company that he and Veronica operated together.

Jimmy was an avid and passionate collector. He had a special affinity for vintage railroad pocket watches, and, although a quiet man, his voice filled the room if you wanted to know about his collection of knives and guns.

He was a man of few words, but when he spoke, the roar of a room filled with people would hush to a whisper. He could captivate an audience with his stories, finding the greatest humor watching people realize that, often, when the punchline finally hit, he was pulling your leg the whole time. Laughter was second nature to him. The King of one-liner dad jokes, he knew a giggle could remedy any bad day.

At all times of the year, through any weather, you could find Jimmy wearing his boots and cowboy hat. Willie and Waylon said don't let your babies grow up to be cowboys – but this cowboy held his family together with his wisdom, grace, and gentle soul. In the earliest days of the bible, God's love is shown through hospitality and generosity. Abraham and his wife Sarah welcomed visitors with open arms and a warm home, not realizing they were welcoming angels. Abraham and Sarah were always busy with guests, never too proud to lend an ear, and from far and wide, people came seeking their advice and comfort. They were an example of God's love here on Earth. In the same way, Jimmy and Veronica never shied away from offering a place of refuge. Jimmy always had the time to help the people he loved. There was never a missed phone call that wasn't returned, never a hole so deep that he couldn't find a ladder to help you out. Jimmy lived each day for his family.

> > Ask a Pharmacist article:

If you don't incorporate a hot toddy into your response to this question, you're probably not doing it right! In all seriousness, the honey in a hot toddy is beneficial to many in quelling a cough. If you are seeking a more "modern" approach, rest, hydration, and first-generation antihistamines (such as chlorpheniramine and diphenhydramine) are the most effective options for drying mucus secretions, and they have a moderate anti-tussive effect. With the added benefit of sedation associated with first-generation antihistamines, you will likely rest easier, as well. However, if you are elderly or have prostate issues, antihistamines are to be avoided.

Another option that may benefit certain patients are dextromethorphan products, which include some cough syrups and suppressants. Then there is the cough drop. Demulcents, which can be found in certain types of cough drops, can soothe irritated throats and decrease the cough reflex in some patients, while menthol-containing drops are modestly effective. Steamy showers and cool-mist humidifiers round out my recommendations for quickly quelling your cough and cold symptoms.

## No. 8 ranked Krum pulls away from Indians in fourth quarter in playoff game

The area rival Bobcats and Indians got out to a relatively even start through the first half of Monday's Region I-4A bi-district round bout at the new Denton High School campus gym, but Krum pulled away late to extend its playoff run.



## 19 year old Sanger female dies in vehicle accident

Two are dead from a crash on Northbound I-35 in Gainesville on Tuesday morning, February 20th that had the freeway shut down for hours.

According to the Texas Department of Public Safety, the accident involved at 18 wheeler towing a trailer and a 2011 Volkswagon Jetta. The driver of the car, 19 year old Lannie Cook of Sanger, died at the scene. A passenger in the car, 22 year old Miles Bartek of Gainesville, also

died at the scene.

A preliminary investigation indicates that vehicle 1 was involved in a previous crash and was disabled in the right northbound lane. Vehicle 2 was traveling northbound and struck vehicle 1. Both occupants of vehicle 2 were not wearing their seatbelt and were ejected. This investigation is ongoing, and no additional information is available.
