Both Dallas Sanger are protesting the permit application with TCEQ, in part due to the lack of levels identified for phosphorus in the discharge that will impact the watershed of everyone downstream.

"So most of these smaller regional plants are designed for specific developments and most of them are able to stay under that 1 million gallon daily rate, which negates their responsibility to mitigate the impact of introducing the [discharged] water into the watershed," Kyle Pedigo, planning and division manager for water utilities, told Denton City Council members during the meet-

The council directed city staff to move forward with an ordinance that will grant the city manager or their designee (i.e. the wautilities department) the ability to file protests against permit applications for sewer plants with-


Charles Wayne Rice


Sanger Yearbook Archive Thumb Drive Fundraiser:
