

Renovations begin at Uptown Rail Brewery in Downtown



Renovations are underway at the Uptown Rail Brewery in Downtown Sanger. The new brewery owners bought the old Hollingsworth Manufacturing Bldg. This is the same group that owns Paxicase Security in Sanger and recently opened Uptown Creamery Ice Cream Shop at 306 Bolivar Street in Downtown.

Uptown Rail Brewery will be located at 204 Bolivar Street for what will be the first business of its kind in Downtown Sanger. Founded by Todd and Vanessa Benson, there will be 7500 square feet usable space, originally built in 1903. Plans call for amenities to be set up outside as well, with a focus on making the brewery a family-friendly destination. "We plan on having an outdoor green space and a stage for live music with food trucks making it a fun environment for families to enjoy," said Todd Benson.

Inside the taproom, Benson expects 15-20 house beers available on a daily basis. The portfolio will consist of a mix of classic and modern styles, with products

Stucky and Hopper runoff will be held May 28

The Republican nomination for the Texas House District 64 seat remains undecided after last Tuesday's primary election.

Texas State House district map in Denton County (HD 64 is in red, and also includes all of Wise County).


Dr. Lynn Stucky, of Sanger, incumbent since 2017, received 43.29% of the 25,123 votes cast, according to unofficial results from the Texas Secretary of State's Office. His chief Republican rival, Andy Hopper, received 46.66% of the vote. In distant third was Elaine Hays with 10.05% of the vote.

Because no one received more than half of the vote, the race heads to a runoff election between Stucky and Hopper on May 28. The winner will face Democrat Angela Brewer, who was unopposed for the Democratic nomination in the primary, in the November General Lynn Stucky

Hopper and Stucky faced off two years ago and it came down to a difference of less than 100 votes, as Stucky won with 50.3% of the vote in the March 2022 primary. Stucky has the support of most municipal and county leaders — including Denton County Judge Andy Eads and all four county commissioners, Denton County Sheriff Tracy Murphree, and current fellow state representatives in neighboring districts, such as Ben Bumgarner, Richard Hayes and Kronda Thimesch. Hopper's top endorsements, however, are Texas state officials — Attorney General Ken Paxton and Agriculture





(Charles) Erwin. He joined the Navy and served in the Korean War. He married LeNonia Starr in 1957. He was preceded in death by her in 1963.




He is survived by son David (Lisa) Erwin and daughter Denise (Don) Sales. Several grandchildren and great grandchildren, one sister, and three brothers.

Financial FOCUS

As you know, interest rates have risen considerably over the past couple of years. But what does this mean to you, as a con-

sumer and as an investor?

From a consumer's standpoint, it's not hard to see the effects of higher interest rates. If you want to take out a mortgage or refinance an existing one, you'll find that it's considerably more costly, in terms of the interest you'll pay, than it was a few years ago. And the same is true of car loans and credit cards. Paying these debts at higher rates can affect your cash flow, so while rates are high, you may need to make some important decisions about your overall budget and spending plans.

As an investor, though, you may find the effects of higher interest rates to be somewhat more complex. That's because higher rates can have a different impact on different types of investments, such as stocks and bonds.

When considering stocks, be aware that not all market sectors will respond the same way to higher interest rates. For example, the financial sector, which includes banks, insurance companies and brokerage firms, may benefit from higher rates. On the other hand, smaller technology companies, which still must invest heavily in their businesses, may not do as well due to rising interest rates making it more expensive for them to borrow. And other sectors will respond differently to higher rates. Keep in mind, though, that there's great variance within sectors and among companies, so when you consider purchasing stocks, evaluate each choice on its

within your risk tolerance, time horizon and need for portfolio diversification. When you diversify your investment dollars, you can reduce the risk of market volatility affecting just one type of asset, although diversification by itself can't protect against all losses

With fixed-income investments, such as bonds, interest rate movements can have significant and direct impacts. When interest rates rise, the value of your current bonds will likely fall because new bonds can pay higher rates. However, you can also buy bonds at the new, higher rates and benefit from bigger interest pay-


Still, there's no guarantee that interest rates will stay elevated – in fact, the Federal Reserve has indicated that it might actually start cutting rates in 2024 - which is why it may be a good idea to build what's known as a "ladder" consisting of short-, intermediate- and long-term bonds. Once you have your ladder in place, you'll have some protection from interest-rate movements. So, if rates were to keep rising, you could reinvest the proceeds of your short-term


merits and make sure it fits bonds in the new, higher-paying ones. But if rates level off, or even fall, you'll still benefit from your lonhigher rates than shortterm ones.

Of course, if you hold your bonds until maturity, you will continue to get the same interest payments, regardless of where market rates go.

In any case, it's useful to be aware of what's happening with interest rates the more you know ger-term bonds, which typ- about the factors affecting ically (but not always) pay your investments, the better off you'll be.

Commissioner Sid Miller and conservative celebrities Ted Nugent and Kyle Rittenhouse.
