### Growing Amaryllis, Narcissus, and Hyacinths Indoors for the Winter Season

TEXAS MASTER SGARDENFR

In the darker days of winter, it's always lovely to have beautiful flowers. Even now it's not too late to consider "forcing" bulbs to enjoy indoor blooms for the winter season.

If you are sensitive to fragrance, then grow amaryllis as they have no scent. For fragrant indoor flowers, you can grow paperwhites (a type of narcissus). Hyacinths are another bulb you can grow for great fragrance, but they will take more prep than narcissus and amaryllis.



If you would like to grow amaryllis or paperwhites, "forcing" is not necessary as these bulbs do not need be chilled. Plant them now, in a container with soil. The container may or may not have a drain hole which is just fine for bulbs. Without a drain hole, your bulbs won't need as much water. Place the planted bulbs in

bright, indirect light. When selecting amaryllis bulbs select larger bulbs. The larger bulb size will have more stored energy and you will see this in the bloom results. Larger



bulbs will also typically produce stronger stems. Check that the bulb is clean and free of mold, decay, or cuts and is firm.

One variety of narcissus bulb, 'Ziva' is known to be divisive. Around 50 percent of people enjoy the scent while 50 percent do not. If you do not care for the fragrance of 'Ziva', then experiment and try other narcissus, like 'Avalanche', 'Grand Soleil 'Winter Sun', or d'Or', 'Ariel'.

found in your yard. Decorative stakes can also be purchased online in garden stores or large retail sites. Tie the plant to your stake with a pretty ribbon, twine, or coated wire.

Hyacinths are fun to grow but need a chilling period to grow indoors. Refrigerate these bulbs for 12 weeks in a paper bag, away from apples, pears, and bananas and then pot in soil or in a hyacinth vase with water. The water should below the bulb, not Top the soil of your touching the root. Handle plantings with colored hyacinth bulbs with gloves as they contain calcium fine gravel. 

There are organizations that offer information and resources for patients and their caregivers, including Dementia Friendly America, a nonprofit national network of communities, organizations, and individuals. Locally, Dementia Friendly Denton County is one of these organizations and promotes organized nature walks, dementia friendly worship services, and meet-ups at cafes and restaurants that are particularly patient with people with dementia related issues. Dr. Michele Steigleder, a Licensed Clinical Psychologist and certified Dementia Care Provider specialist, is a board member of this group, and will be speaking at Sanger Public Library on Thursday, February 8, at 6:30 to give an overview of dementia and what resources are available.

Sanger Public Library will also debut their new cognitive care kits, which are designed to educate caregivers, encourage positive interactions, and facilitate reminiscence with people dealing with the cognitive struggles brought on by dementia. Currently, there are three kits available: one each for early, mid, and advanced stage dementia. Each kit has one or more informative books for caregivers, and a variety of puzzles, games, and memory prompt activities which have been tailored for where a person with dementia is on their path. Activities can be done mostly independently or within a group setting, and can be modified to meet a specific person's ability or interest. A kit may be checked out for two weeks, with renewals available as demand permits.

To learn more about dementia, be sure to attend Dr. Steigleder's presentation on the 8th and investigate the library's cognitive care kits. For more information, phone 940-458-3257 or come by the library at 501 Bolivar St.
