

Sanger Sixth Grade Center student suffers serious injuries, loses two siblings in tornado

Two victims were identified on Monday as 2-yearold Essence McCrary and her brother 5-year-old Tyrique McCrary. A county official confirmed to WFAA that they found the two siblings in the pond behind a neighbor's home.

Their 12-year-old sister Zamiya, a student at Sixth Grade Center in Sanger is hospitalized with back injuries. She was babysitting her siblings when her mother left to go pick up her husband from work before their home was swept off its foundation, witnesses told WFAA.

Victor Ortiz was also killed, WFFA confirmed Monday. He was a father and a grandfather. Other members of his family were also injured. They set up a GoFundMe to help with essential resources and funeral were destroyed and 120 arrangements.

"I am very sad for them to have lost their lives, God only knows why this happened," the kids' aunt, Irma Cancino, said in Spanish, weeping. "It's the deepest pain I've ever felt in my heart." (Continued on pg. 7)

At least 7 people were killed and 100 were injured in a tornado outbreak in North Texas on Saturday night. Four tornadoes were confirmed. Seven people died, including at least 100 people have been injured after at least three tornadoes in Cooke, Collin and Denton counties on Saturday night.



Andy Hopper defeats Lynn Stucky for Texas

Andy Hopper has defeated incumbent Lynn Stucky in the race for the Republican nomination to represent District 64 in the Texas House of Representatives.

In Tuesday's primary runoff, complete but unofficial results showed Hopper winning with 58.11% of the votes to Stucky's 41.89% — a difference of nearly 2,500

Hopper will face Angela Brewer, who ran unopposed for the Democratic nomination, in November.

Hopper took a 3.4 percentage-point lead over Stucky — a difference of 851 ballots — in the March 5 primary. Hopper had 46.7% of the vote compared to Stucky's 43.3% then.

Hopper succeeded in his second attempt to take the seat Stucky has held since 2016. In 2022, Hopper lost to Stucky by less than 100 votes.

Stucky captured about 56% of the vote in Denton County, but Hopper had more support in the rest of Texas House District 64. The district covers the entirety of Wise County, as well as most of the city of Denton, plus Krum and northwestern Denton County, including some of Sanger.



The Denton County Office of Emergency Management assessed damage beginning at daylight Sunday to determine what services might be needed by Denton County residents. Soon, teams were bringing in water, a tent for shade, and restroom facilities to help the RV park residents as they picked through the rubble of their former

Just a few miles away, crews were working to repair downed power lines and remove overturned 18-wheelers. Just north of the border between Denton and Cooke counties, a walk-in freezer stood out among the remnants of a Shell station where a number of people had been trapped after the tornado tore through the building.

Several Denton County residents with injuries were transported to Denton and area hospitals via ambulance and CareFlite. The number of people injured, and the types of injuries were not known as of 2 p.m. Sunday.







Cancino is their father's sister. He survived, she said, but is undergoing serious surgery

Marco and Miranda have two surviving siblings. Marco loved to talk, tell stories and play soccer, Cancino said. Miranda loved school and volleyball.

The family is in need of help paying for funeral expenses. Anyone wishing to help can do so by donating to their GoFundMe.

Gabriel Landeros lived a few doors

down from the Esparzas. He told WFAA he found their bodies and covered them with blankets until first responders could arrive

"I covered them with blankets, I felt sad, I didn't sleep all night," he told WFAA in Spanish. "I watched over their bodies."

Landeros told WFAA he and his son narrowly survived the tornado in his truck. It felt like the truck flew in the air, he said, and a tree pierced through it. He said he's worked his whole life to afford his home, has no insurance, and nothing left.


"We lost everything, we're on the street...My soul breaks, I have no explanation," he said.
