Sanger Sixth Grade Center student suffers serious injuries, loses two siblings in tornado

Two victims were identified on Monday as 2-year-old Essence McCrary and her brother 5-year-old Tyrique McCrary. A county official confirmed to WFAA that they found the two siblings in the pond behind a neighbor's home.

Their 12-year-old sister Zamiya, a student at Sixth Grade Center in Sanger is hospitalized with back injuries. She was babysitting her siblings when her mother left to go pick up her husband from work before their home was swept off its foundation, witnesses told WFAA.

Victor Ortiz was also killed, WFAA confirmed Monday. He was a father and a grandfather. Other members of his family were also injured. They set up a GoFundMe to help with essential resources and funeral arrangements.

Llyod Watson was the seventh victim confirmed dead after the EF-3 tornado swept through the area.

Sunday, three other victims that were killed were identified as Miranda, Marco and Laura Esparza. Laura Esparza was the mother of Miranda, 15, and Marco, 9.

"I am very sad for them to have lost their lives, God only knows why this happened," the kids' aunt, Irma Cancino, said in Spanish, weeping. "It's the deepest pain I've ever felt in my heart."

Deadly Tornado sweeps through area

This is a picture of the tornado heading southeast that crosses I-35 near Lone Oak Road, a few miles north of Sanger. It was about 400 yards wide.

At least 7 people were killed and 100 were injured in a tornado outbreak in North Texas on Saturday night. Four tornadoes were confirmed. Seven people died, including at least three children, and at least 100 people have been injured after at least three tornadoes in Cooke, Collin and Denton counties on Saturday night.

Texas Governor Greg Abbott came to Cooke County on Sunday, the area that was the hardest hit. He issued a disaster declaration for the affected counties.

More than 200 homes were destroyed and 120 were damaged, according to the governor.

Governor Abbott urged anyone who suffered property damage to contact their insurance companies and go to damagedem.texas.gov.

The National Weather Service surveyed the damage. The NWS determined an EF3 tornado hit Celina in Collin County with winds up to 165 miles per hour, an EF-2 tornado with winds up to 125 mph hit Valley View and Sanger and an EF-2 tornado in Forestburg in Montague County.

The hardest hit area from the tornado outbreak was the Lone Oak Road area, just north of Sanger and in between to the Lake Ray Roberts Marina off

FM 455 in Sanger.

"Night time tornadoes are one of the most dangerous out there. People aren't paying attention and it's hard to see the threat," said Jennifer Dunn, a meteorologist with the National Weather Service in Fort Worth.

Dozens of people took shelter at a Shell Station on I-35 and Lone Oak Road as an EF-2 tornado ripped through the area. The people were inside the station at the time taking cover, including children. Some people were injured, but all survived. "It truly is a miracle," said Gov. Abbott. Metal pieces from the building wrapped around power poles and the roof

caved in. Vehicles in the area were thrown into a nearby pasture. The mobile home park on the west side of I-35 wasn't as lucky with devastating damage and deaths.

The storm crossed to Lake Ray Roberts. Lake Ray Roberts Marina and RVs in Pilot Point were hit, tearing up the docks and sinking a number of boats. Many of those that weren't sunk are damaged. Residents say the owner of the RV park drove through the area honking his horn to make sure everyone was up and taking cover. Denton County says a number of people with injuries were taken to hospitals via

Andy Hopper defeats Lynn Stucky for Texas House District 64

Andy Hopper has defeated incumbent Lynn Stucky in the race for the Republican nomination to represent District 64 in the Texas House of Representatives.

In Tuesday's primary runoff, complete but unofficial results showed Hopper winning with 58.11% of the votes to Stucky's 41.89% — a difference of nearly 2,500 votes.

Hopper will face Angela Brewer, who ran unopposed for the Democratic nomination, in November.

Hopper took a 3.4 percentage-point lead over Stucky — a difference of 851 ballots — in the March 5 primary. Hopper had 46.7% of the vote compared to Stucky's 43.3% then.

Hopper succeeded in his second attempt to take the seat Stucky has held since 2016. In 2022, Hopper lost to Stucky by less than 100 votes.

Stucky captured about 56% of the vote in Denton County, but Hopper had more support in the rest of Texas House District 64. The district covers the entirety of Wise County, as well as most of the city of Denton, plus Krum and northwestern Denton County, including some of Sanger.

Marina RV Park hit hard by tornado

Heartbreak and sadness fill the Lake Ray Roberts Marina RV Park that was hit by a Saturday evening tornado. All the RVs are damaged or destroyed, but amazingly, everyone escaped alive.

Sidney Lepard fled the Lake Ray Roberts Marina RV Park in Sanger in her vehicle after a tornado warning. She couldn't believe her eyes when she returned.

"When we drove up, Charles says, 'The bus is gone!' I said, 'Where could a 40-foot bus be gone to?'" Lepard said.

Lepard and her husband lived in their RV at the park for the past 10 years.

"I have stuff that's scattered all the way to the lake," Lepard said.

The couple finally found their home, which is now nothing more than a pile of debris.

"I think I was just in shock mostly," Lepard said. "The devastation was just unreal."

It's a roller coaster of emotions as Lepard sifts through her mangled belongings.

"You look at stuff that's kind of comical, and you have to laugh about it. Then you look at the devastation, and you want to cry," Lepard said.

Lepard found a few sentimental items mixed in the rubble, but otherwise, she has to start over.

"Basically, everything is destroyed," Lepard said. "We found some clothing. We have found some pictures, some jewelry, but other than that, everything's gone."

Frank Soltysiak and his 20-year-old dog lived in what was their RV. It was next to a deck, and the tornado carried it about 50 yards.

"We could hear it all around us. It was like a freight ran right through," Soltysiak said.

Soltysiak and his Maltese "Sampson," who is blind and deaf, hid in the park's restaurant cooler along with several other

people. Soltysiak said the RV park owner honked his horn and got residents inside the cooler before the tornado tore the park apart.

"All of a sudden, we felt the air get sucked right out, so we went running in. When I was running to the cooler, I could see the ceiling heave up," Soltysiak said.

The pair and everyone else at the RV park are putting back the pieces of their lives.

"This is my home," Soltysiak said. "I started doing the RV life, Sampson and I, and we were loving it."

"We will most likely get another type of RV. We won't live here because it's going to be such devastation for them to repair. It'll be a long time," Lepard said. "We'd like to move back if it reopens."

Lepard's belongings may be lost, but what she found is a community moving from a surge of destruction to an appreciation for life.

Denton County assists families at RV park, other areas with recovery following tornado

A young woman remembered the keys she put in her pocket just before Saturday's tornado and used them to set off her car alarm so first responders would know where to find her as she lay pinned under her RV trailer just east of Sanger.

She was one of more than 20 families who suffered the total loss of their homes in an RV trailer park near Lake Ray Rob-

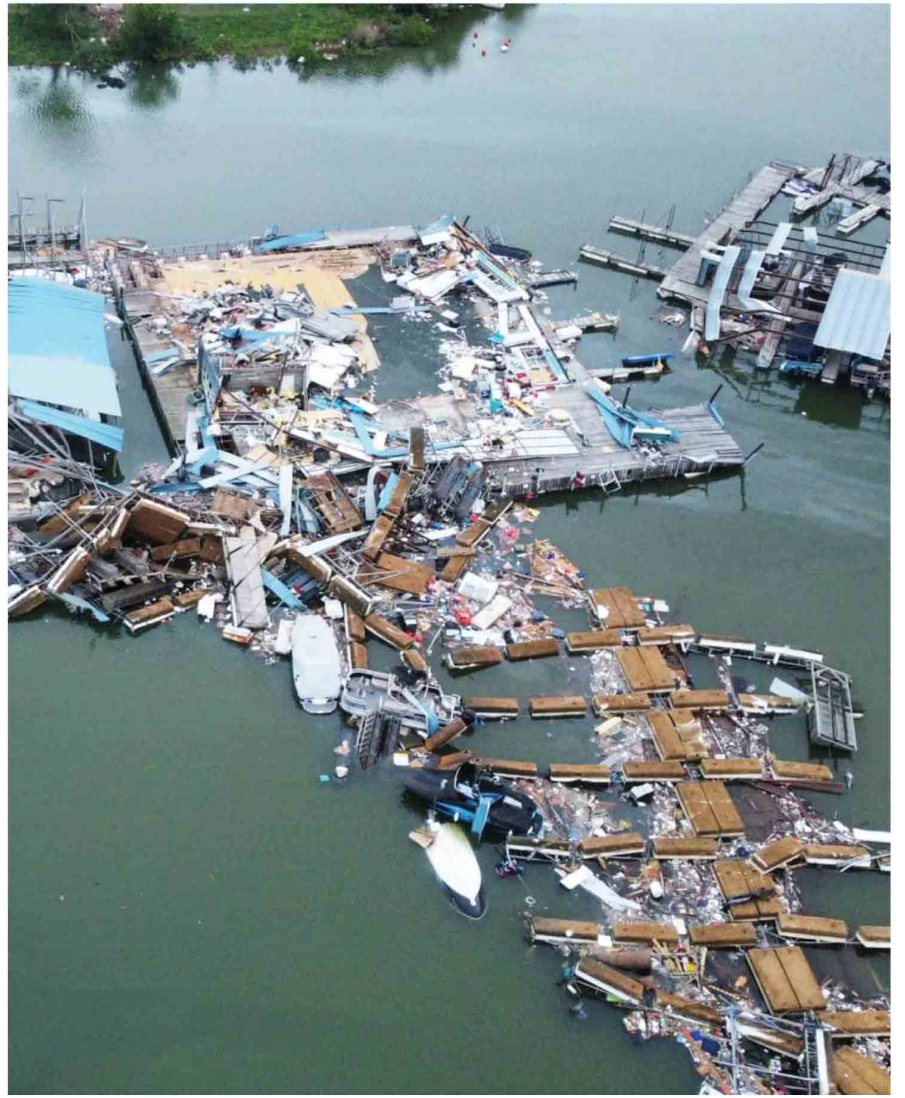
erts Marina just off FM 455. Several residents were taken to the hospital for injuries they received as their trailers were tossed by the tornado that struck after dark.

On Sunday, the young woman returned battered and bruised to find the last of her three cats, "Missy." Nearby, the daughter of another resident, now hospitalized, cried out with glee when she found her

father's medicine amid the scattered contents of the crumpled trailers.

Boat owners lined the road leading into the marina on the southwest end of Lake Ray Roberts to glimpse at the jumbled boat slips wrecked by the storm.

Damage was reported to the Lake Ray Roberts Marina and RVs on the Sanger side of Ray Roberts Lake and at Isle du Bois

State Park. Power outages, uprooted trees, and downed limbs were reported from west of Sanger across the lake along FM 455 into Pilot Point.

The Denton County Office of Emergency Management assessed damage beginning at daylight Sunday to determine what services might be needed by Denton County residents. Soon, teams were bringing in water, a tent for shade, and restroom facilities to help the RV park residents as they picked through the rubble of their former lives.

Just a few miles away, crews were working to repair downed power lines and remove overturned 18-wheelers. Just north of the border between Denton and Cooke counties, a walk-in freezer stood out among the remnants of a Shell station where a number of people had been trapped after the tornado tore through the building.

Several Denton County residents with injuries were transported to Denton and area hospitals via ambulance and CareFlite. The number of people injured, and the types of injuries were not known as of 2 p.m. Sunday.

Smith Farm in Sanger takes direct hit from tornado

Lisa and Todd Smith live and work off their property, Smith Farms, at 690 County Road 241 just between Lone Oak and Chisam roads, just north of Sanger. Their two children Ellie and Connor are graduates of Sanger High School.

"I've owned this property since 2006," Todd said.

Nearly 20 years of hard work on their land were tossed in the air and gone in less than 20 minutes after an EF-2 tornado destroyed anything in its path.

"I really can't stop and think about it too much 'cause I gotta keep going," Todd said. "So, I think a little bit of shock is still there."

Todd, Lisa, and their dog Bailey hid in their bathroom Saturday night.

"Our ears started to pop (from) the pressure," Lisa said. "The water in the sink and toilet was gurgling. That's when we knew we were getting hit. The whole house was shaking. We could hear that the whole roof had gone."

Lisa said it was the hardest she had ever prayed.

"My repeated words

were, 'Jesus please save us,' over and over and over. 'Jesus please save us,'" Lisa said.

Their lives were spared; however, they mourn the loss of their dog Reggie, Todd's horse Colonel, and multiple livestock.

"The hardest part for me is the farm and my animals," Lisa said. "The animals are everything to me. That's the hardest part, just knowing where we go from here."

Faithful clients and friends have helped clear out the piles of debris and some personal belongings that survived the tornado.

"We have a fantastic community around us," Lisa said. "They've busted their butts to help us clean up, and it's hot out there, too. They've been bringing food, water, and I had one customer show up with clothes."

While Monday's high temperatures did not slow down the work of volunteers, the chance for storms made them uneasy.

"We might not be able to stick around because there's still so much loose tin. If the winds pick up, it might not be safe," Lisa said.

The Smiths said their

biggest needs are feed for their livestock and storage space for their large machinery.

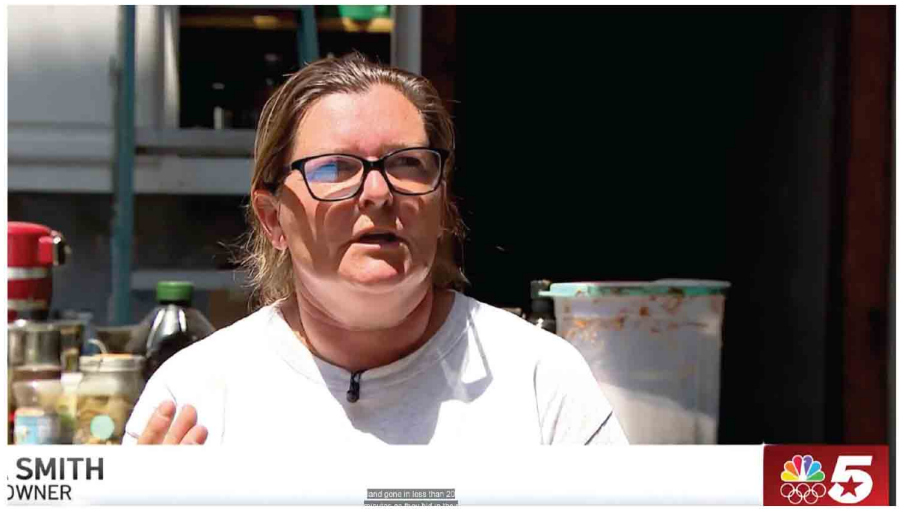
"Right now, we probably have a couple of days (of feed) to keep it going. We grow and harvest our own grains and hay to feed the animals. That's all gone. We can't just plant anymore and it be there in the next few days. It is a whole year's process," Lisa said. "We're going to need a whole year's supply to keep our animals going. If we don't have that, we'll probably have to find somewhere else for them to go."

As for the future of Smith's Farms, the couple said it is too soon to know.

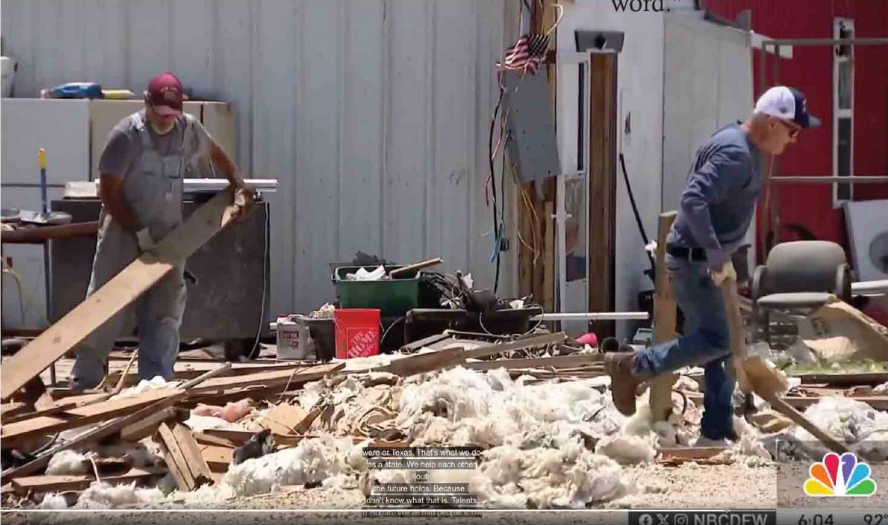
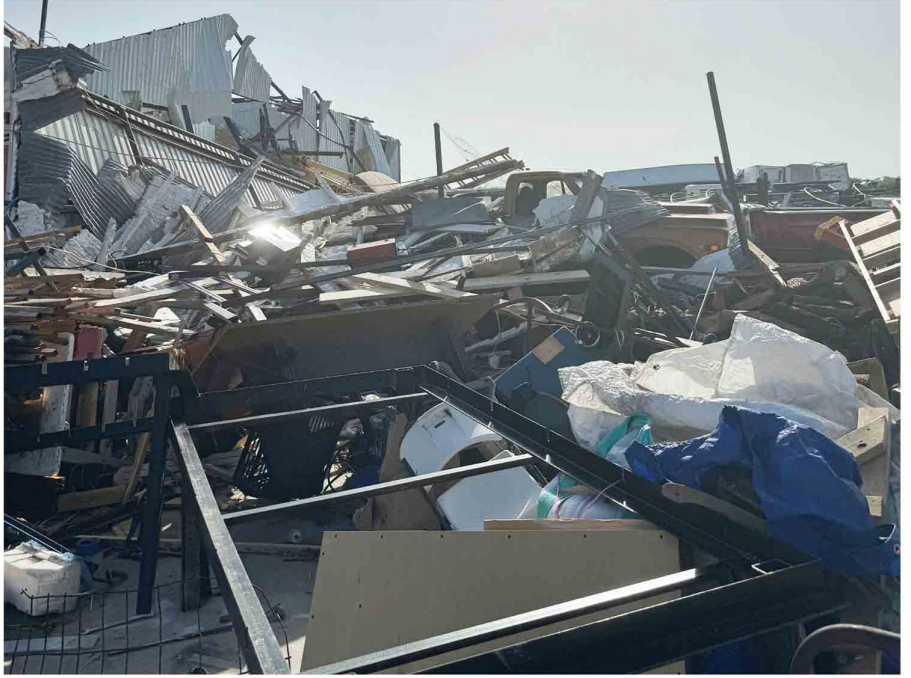
"I mean, we're going to have to completely rebuild everything from the ground up," Lisa said. "I know that we've been much more fortunate than others," Lisa said. "Some others are less fortunate, and our prayers are with them."

While feed for livestock is the family's main need, a friend of the Smith's helped launch a GoFundMe.

"I just want to thank the community. They've been so great," Lisa said. "We're just overwhelmed, in every sense of the word."

ambulance and CareFlite. Homes on off and near Chisam Road were damaged and destroyed with roofs sucked off, metal shops tangled and thrown everywhere. Trees were mangled and round bales were flying in the air. The Smith's Farm was demolished. See

page 6. The Ray Roberts Marina and RV Park were destroyed as well. See pages 4-5. First Baptist Church in Sanger had over 100 volunteers show up to help with the cleanup at area homes. The marina reports many people are helping with the cleanup on the marina land property. But, the lake part, where the gas dock/ships store and boat slips are located will take months.

Cancino is their father's sister. He survived, she said, but is undergoing serious surgery.

Marco and Miranda have two surviving siblings. Marco loved to talk, tell stories and play soccer, Cancino said. Miranda loved school and volleyball.

The family is in need of help paying for funeral expenses. Anyone wishing to help can do so by donating to their GoFundMe.

Gabriel Landeros lived a few doors

down from the Esparzas. He told WFAA he found their bodies and covered them with blankets until first responders could arrive.

"I covered them with blankets, I felt sad, I didn't sleep all night," he told WFAA in Spanish. "I watched over their bodies."

Landeros told WFAA he and his son narrowly survived the tornado in his truck. It felt like the truck flew in the air, he said, and a tree pierced through it. He said he's worked his whole life to afford his home, has no insurance, and nothing left.

"We lost everything, we're on the street...My soul breaks, I have no explanation," he said.

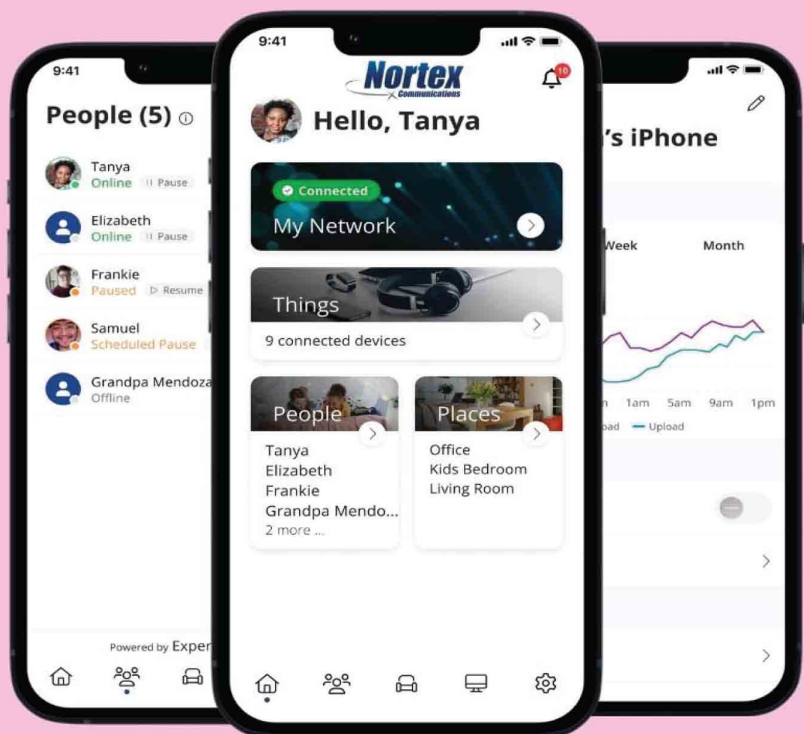

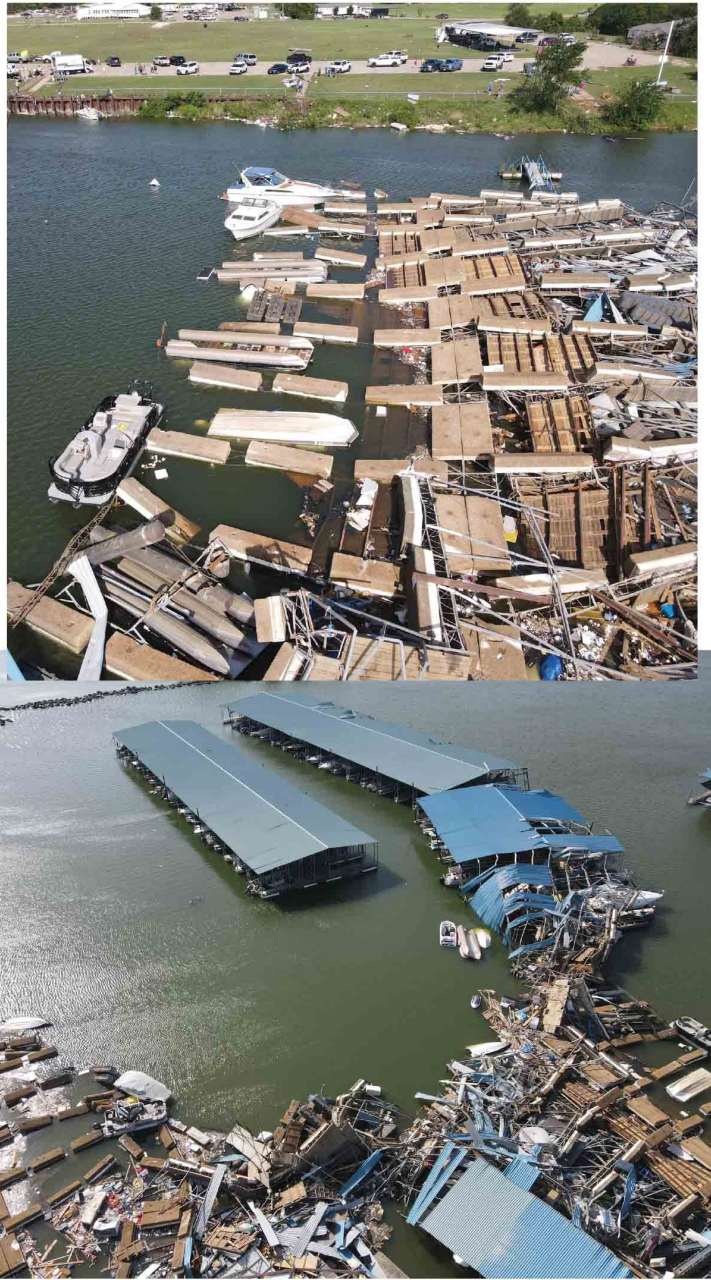

Lady Indians make it to State Softball Tournament

Sanger earned their second trip to the state tournament in last Thursday's Game 2 of the Region I-4A championship against Pampa. Sanger got a walk-off sacrifice bunt in the bottom of the eighth to complete the sweep for a 4-3 victory at Midwestern State University in Wichita Falls.

The Lady Harvesters, who were making their first regional final in 10 years, ended with a 22-14 overall record.

No. 4 ranked Sanger (37-7) advances to the UIL Class 4A state tournament in Austin. It's the Lady Indians first appearance at state since winning the title in Class 3A back in 2001.

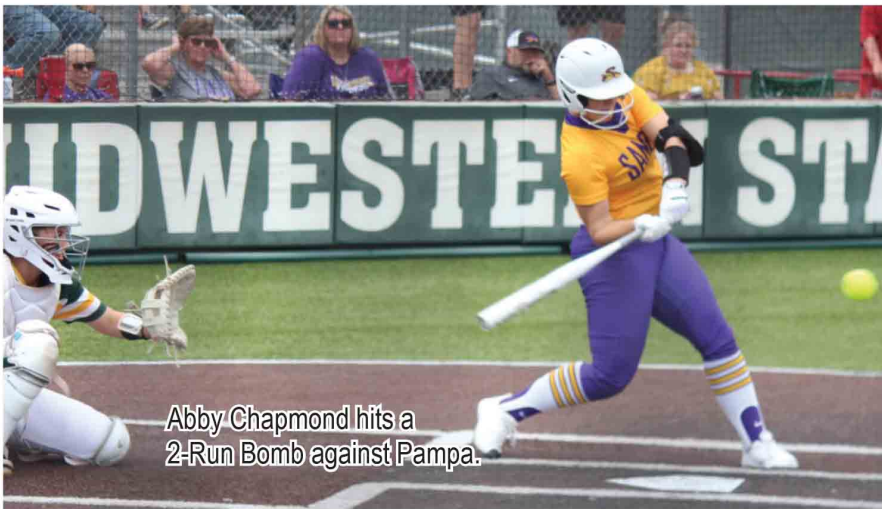
They face Corpus Christi Callalen (32-2) on Thursday at 4 p.m. The other semifinal features Liberty (40-2) vs. Canton (32-8) at 7 p.m. at McCombs Field at the University of Texas in Austin.

In game 1, runs came at a premium in the series opener on Wednesday night at Midwestern State. Both Sanger's Leala Kloewer and Pampa's Kynleigh Kirby were dealing in the circle allowing a total of three hits between them.

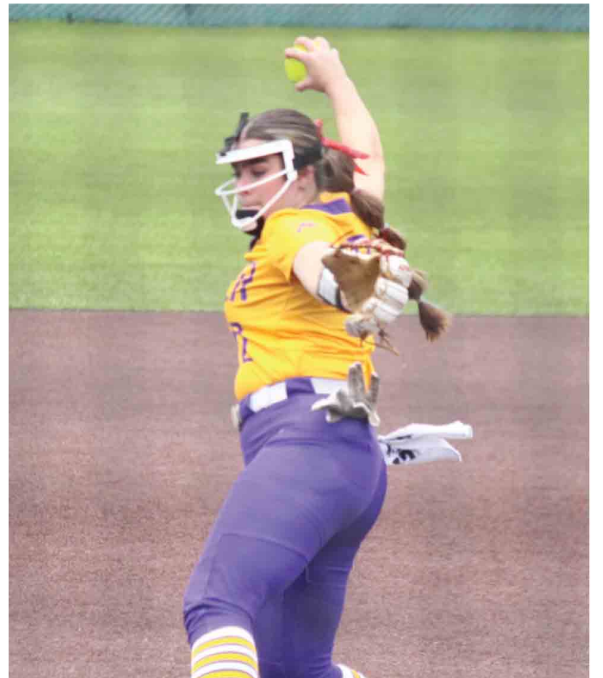
Sanger struck early in the top of the first. After a walk to Kyle Cochran, MaKynna Meeks hit a sacrifice fly scoring Cochran for an early 1-0 lead. That score didn't change until the Lady Indians finally found a hit against Kirby on an RBI double from Piper Lindlau in the top of the sixth giving Sanger much needed insurance up 2-0.

That was more than enough for Kloewer who handcuffed the Lady Harvesters tossing all seven innings allowing only two hits with 12 K's. Kirby finished with a complete game of her own allowing a hit with three strikeouts and the two earned runs.

The bats came alive in game 2 - The Lady Harvesters went up 1-0 in the top of the second when Karina Gonzales delivered a single plating Haili Newton. In the third, Kirby helped her own cause

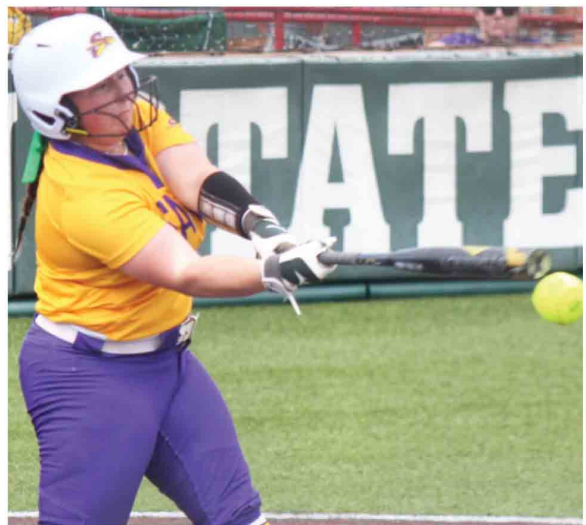
ans runners at second and third with one out. That set up Sophia Troegle who laid down a squeeze bunt down that line scoring Miller who slid under the tag of Pampa catcher

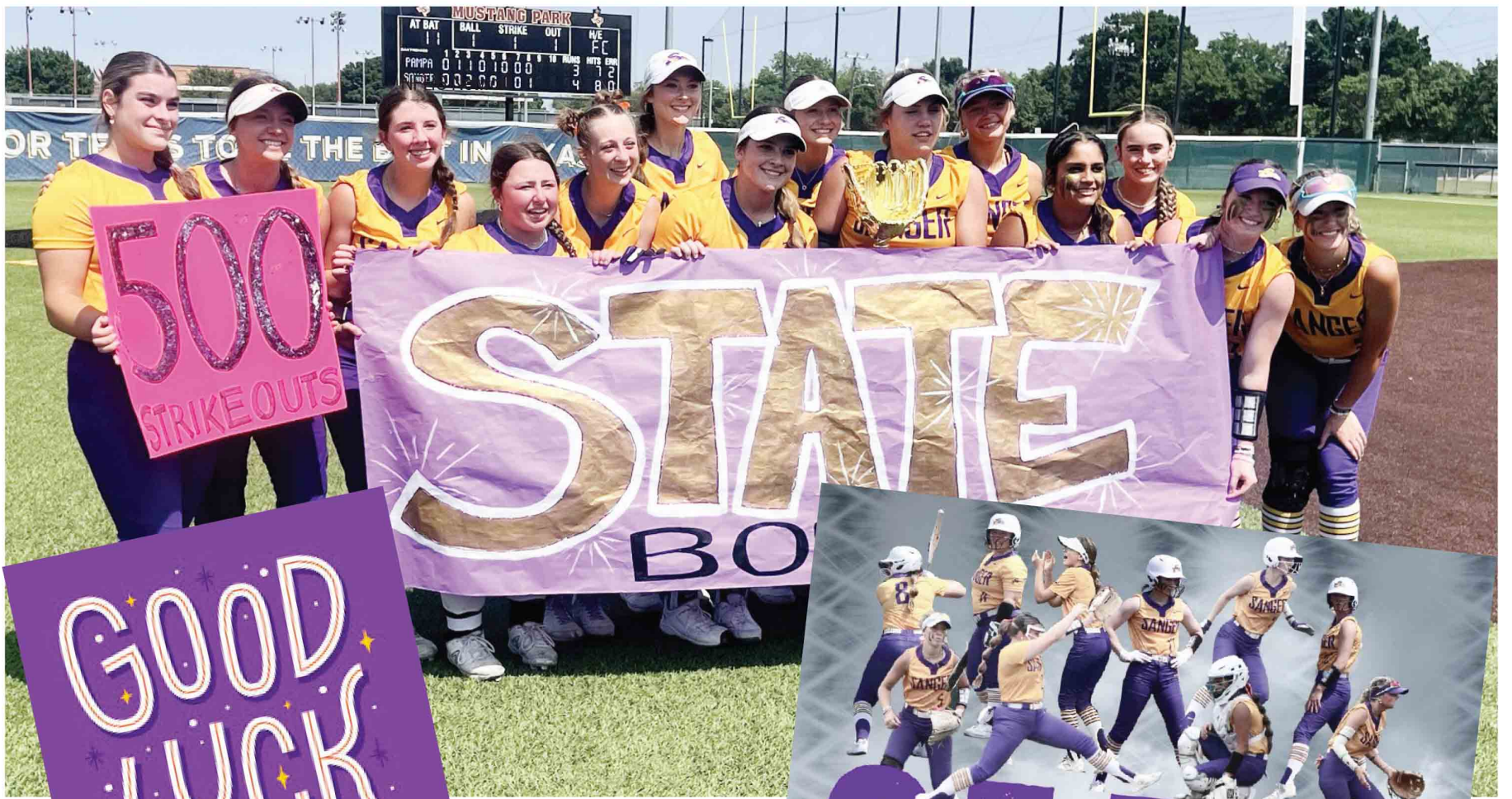
