Sanger ISD implements Four-Day School Week

Sanger Independent School District is proud to adopt a four-day instructional week for the upcoming 2024-2025 academic year. Following extensive research, community engagement, and discussions, the SISD Board of Trustees unanimously approved this change on Monday night, which will take effect in August of the upcoming school year.

The new schedule will feature a traditional five-day week during the months of August and September, transitioning to a four-day instructional week in October through the remainder of the school year. Campuses within the district will operate from Monday through Thursday, with daily instructional time extended by a modest 35 minutes.

"We believe that this transition to a four-day instructional week aligns with our commitment to innovative teaching and learning practices," stated Dr. Tommy Hunter, Superintendent of Sanger ISD. "Our goal is to better serve our students, teachers, and families while addressing the challenges posed by the nationwide teacher shortage."

Under the new schedule, teachers and staff will work one Friday per month, providing them at least three Fridays off each month for personal and family commitments. This flexi-



bility aims to enhance teacher retention and job satisfaction while promoting a healthy work-life balance.

The district is currently in discussions with various programs to offer educational opportunities tailored explicitly for Fridays. These programs will cater to the educational needs of up to 300 students in grades K-5 who meet specific criteria. For eligible students, participation in the program will be free, with only a small registration fee. However, should students outside the criteria wish to participate, they may do so at their parents' expense.

Throughout the 2024-2025 school year, Sanger ISD remains committed to soliciting feedback from stakeholders to evaluate the effectiveness of the four-day instructional week and make necessary adjustments to support the success of students, families, and educators.




This is the Sanger Presbyterian Church, which was built in 1902, with its original roofline. The gable to the left of the steeple was later removed. It has a unique flooring slanted towards the rostrum. The final church service was held in August 1971. The building was no longer a place of worship, and became city property in 1987 and it functioned as a Library until the new library was built in 1995. It was designated a Texas Historical Landmark in 1972 and it's recently been restored with city council meetings are held there now. It is located at 401 N. 7th Street and the public can rent it for special events.






The Sanger Area Historical Society recognized Nel Armstrong. In honor of International Women's Day earlier this month, Sanger's first and only female Mayor. Sanger elected Nel (Haynie) Armstrong as Mayor in 1984 and served through 1996. She graduated from Sanger High School before attending Baylor University. While member of Denton County Historical Society, Armstrong was instrumental in Bolivar Cemetery being the first in the state to be designated an "Official Historic Texas Cemetary". In 1999 she founded the Sanger Area Historical Society and served as Board Chairperson and President. Armstrong was instrumental in obtaining a Texas Historical Landmark designation for the Presbyterian Church, and led the efforts to build a new structure for the Public Library. She was a Sunday School teacher at First Baptist Church of Sanger for over 53 years and was the Church Clerk and Librarian for over 10 years. Former Mayor Mary Nell (Nel) Armstrong passed away on January 2, 2018.
