Sanger Electric and CoServ announce fixed rates

City of Sanger and CoServ electric customers are fortunate after the artic storm last week.

As Texas faced record-low temperatures snow and ice made roads impassable, the state's electric grid operator lost control of the power supply, leaving millions without access to electricity. As the blackouts extended from hours to days, top state lawmakers called for investigations into the Electric Reliability Council of Texas, and Texans demanded accountability for the disaster. We have compiled a tions about your account list of resources for Texans who are seeking help, or places to get warm.

Gov. Greg Abbott and Texas lawmakers are promising relief for Texans hit with massive electric bills after a winter storm bludgeoned the state's power grid, leaving millions of residents freezing without electricity.

But how they'll accomplish that remains unclear. The state's deregulated electricity market not only allows for staggering price spikes, but effectively compels them for some customers.

While many Texans you use. are on "fixed rate" elec-City of Sanger and CoServ, that insulate them from market swings, others pay rates tied to the spot price of wholesale electricity, which skyrocketed during

the storm. As the bad weather bore down, it froze natural gas production and wind turbines, choking off the supply of electricity as demand skyrocketed. In response, the Public Utility Commission, appointed by Abbott, let the wholesale market price of electricity rise to \$9 per kilo-watt hour, a 7,400% increase over the average 12 cents per kilo-watt hour.

The rate hike was supposed to entice power generators to get more juice into the grid, but the astounding costs were also passed directly on to some customers, who were suddenly being billed more for electricity each day than they normally pay in a month.

The City of Sanger released a statement to the public - "Sanger Electric Utilities is a municipal electric utility. News





Electric Rates

CoServ Electric, like every electric provider, receives mandates from ERCOT during an EEA 3 emergency on how much electricity we are required to take off the grid to keep it operational. Depending on how much electricity demand ERCOT requires us to shed, we must look at the number of circuits needed to turn off – and circuits with Members that address critical needs (hospitals, nursing homes, sewer systems, etc.) are prioritized to receive power – which is why some homes or neighborhoods on a circuit with Members that address critical needs aren't impacted by the rotating outages. These requirements are grouped by priority, based upon the size and number of critical loads on each feeder. For more information on critical needs accounts visit: https://bit.ly/3smIXdb

Why am I seeing all this usage on my SmartHub account when I wasn't receiving electricity during an outage?

SmartHub is designed to give each Member an estimated view of ongoing usage on their account. The "charges" some of our Members are seeing during an outage reflect estimated (not actual) usage from SmartHub to fill in the gaps and assist you in planning your usage for the rest of the month. To reduce confusion, we have taken this feature offline which will avoid a misrepresentation of the usage that occurred in your home/business during the extreme weather event last week.

Is the SmartHub issue the same as the one that has been in the news regarding smart meters and high bills?

No. SmartHub is a tool designed to fill in the gaps and assist you in planning your usage for the rest of the month. Smart meters send actual usage data to the electric provider. The media reports are referencing electric providers that send out monthly bills based on an estimated usage read from a smart meter. The chances of an estimated billing read being utilized on your CoServ electric bill are less than .04%. Should an estimated read be utilized for your bill, you will be contacted directly

Am I going to get a higher than usual bill next month?

The CoServ Electric Board has decided that the rate set on February 1, 2021 which includes the Power Cost Recovery Factor (PCRF), will remain the same as it was before the extreme winter weather last week. The rate details, including the PCRF, can be found here: https://bit.ly/3qK2zrj This guarantees that our Members will not be severely impacted by the high wholesale prices that all electric providers faced during this time. The PCRF has been in place to consistently help spread anticipated higher costs over a longer period of time to benefit our Members. We will not be charging late fees and will suspend disconnections for nonpayment for the next 30 days. Impacts to your bill related to usage may change the amount you pay, particularly if you have electric heat, heat pumps, pool equipment or utilized space heaters during the extreme weather.







Dallas Pinkston knocks Sanger out of the playoffs

After losses to Dallas Pinkston in 2019 and 2020 ended Sanger's playoff runs early, the Lady Indians basketball team believed this year would be different on Saturday afternoon at Coppell High School, in an area contest (second-round).

Circumstances were stacked against them, though, with Sanger facing the Lady Vikings' (23-5) fierce pressure defense with only one practice due to the inclement weather and before that their firstround bi-district playoff game won by forfeit.

The Lady Indians (20-6) bolted out to a 6-0 lead and led at halftime 25-22, but eventually Pinkston found its footing and stormed back to defeat Sanger 57-46 in the Class 4A Region II area playoff round.

"This is the third year in a row we've played [Pinkston] and we just continue to get better and we did all we could do," Sanger coach Derek Hilliard said. "This year we believed. Last year we were scared to death, but this year we were ready and knew we could do it. They fought till the end, it just doesn't always work out."

As if it wasn't hard enough to play the frenetic and explosive Lady Vikings, senior Chloe Malone got into foul trouble. Three fouls in the first quarter and another in the second sent the Lady Indians' star wing to the bench, forcing Hilliard to drop into a zone

drop into a zone.

That's when Pinkston started burying 3-pointers. By the end, the Lady Vikings had hit six 3-pointers, each time allowing them to set up their vaunted press.

"We had Chloe on their leading scorer, but then we had to go to the zone, which worked for a while, but then they started hitting [3-pointers]," Hilliard said. "They had a little bit more than we could handle today and when [two key players] get in foul trouble, it's tough.


Still, Sanger continued scrapping, staying within reach until late in the fourth quarter. Malone eventually fouled out in the final frame with nine points. Sophomore Lexi Martin led the Lady Indians with 16 points while fellow sophomore Carly Shumaker pitched in 11 of her own.

Sanger loses two seniors Malone and Phoenix Dillon. They both helped the Lady Indians to the first District Championship since 2011.

District runner-up Melissa beat Dallas Lincoln 67-47 to advance to the regional-quarterfinals. They played Midlothian Heritage this week. Pinkston played Kennedale on Wednesday.


