25-year old man drowns from storm Sunday evening

Authorities have located the body of a Tioga man who drowned in Lake Ray Roberts over the weekend.

Game Warden Captain Cliff Swofford says search crews found Collin Dean's body around 9:30 a.m. Tuesday.

Crews spent all day Monday on the water

searching for his body, and will resume the search Tuesday morning.

Game wardens say Collin Dean, 25, was riding a jet ski when the storm came through between 7:30 and 8 o'clock Sunday night. Winds up to 60 mph were reported, blowing out of the north

and huge water swells

crashed in to the dam.

Capt. Cliff Swofford says a report of a drowning came in around that time.

The jet ski washed up on shore, but Dean wasn't seen again.

He says Dean was riding on the jet ski next

70% registered for face to face learning at SISD

Sanger ISD school starts Monday, August 24, 2020. Sanger parents and students can choose which learning platform they will utilize for the upcoming school year. This year, SISD offers either face-to-face learning or online learning for students. As of Wednesday morning around 30% registered online only and 70% will do face-to-face learning.

Argyle students on Monday morning became some of the first locals to head back to the classroom.

Roughly 3,000 students spread across the district campuses were required to wear face coverings and adhere to various other health guidelines.

More than 80% of Argyle ISD students opted to attend classes in-person, according to a presenta-

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT

SANGER ISD Amendment to Return To Learning

Pk - 12th grade will wear a mask when entering, exiting, or transitioning in a building.

Pk - 12th grade will wear a mask when riding on a school bus.

Pk - 2nd grade will be allowed to remove masks when in the classroom and social distancing is achieved.

3rd - 12th grade will wear a mask at all times except when doing physical activities in P.E., at recess, or during lunch.

ADDITIONAL UPDATE TO THE AMENDED RETURN TO LEARNING PLAN CONCERNING FACE MASKS: In a classroom where social distancing is taking place, a student may replace the mask with a face shield. If they are working in small groups where social distancing is not taking place, masks are required. So shields are only allowed in classrooms where social distancing is available.

Freezing cold winters, rain, blistering summers never deterred him from his work. He had a family to sup-

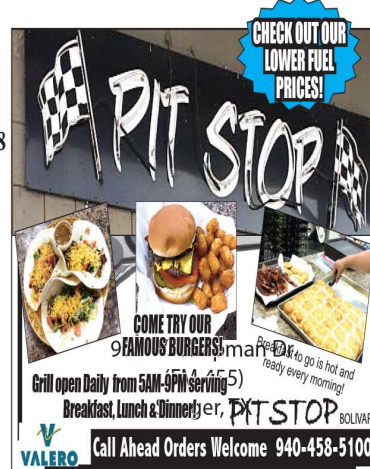

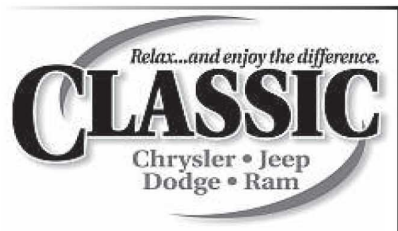

The COVID-19 pandemic has unsettled the country's employment picture for months and will likely continue to do so for a while. However, the nature and terminology of this disruption varies greatly among individuals – some have seen their jobs disappear, others have been “furloughed” and still others have been offered an early retirement. If you're

What Does an Unplanned Career Transition Mean for You?

in this final group – those either offered, or feeling forced to accept, an early retirement, how should you respond?

Try to look at your situation holistically, rather than strictly in a short-term manner. Consider these four areas:

Retirement – What does retirement really look like to you? Are you ready to fully retire or would you like to work part time? Are you confident that you can work somewhere else for a few years before retiring on your own terms? If you're not certain you can work elsewhere, how can you adjust your desired retirement lifestyle – what you planned to do, where you hoped to live, etc. – to meet your new reality?

Income – Just how financially affected you'll be from an early retirement depends on several factors: how much you've already saved and invested, whether you're married and have a working spouse, whether you've paid off your mort-

gage, and so on. In any case, though, you'll need to answer several questions, including these: Do I need to start taking withdrawals from my IRA and 401(k)? If I haven't yet started collecting Social Security, should I do so now, or can I afford to wait until my monthly payments will be bigger? Are there any other sources of income I can leverage? You may want to work with a financial professional to address these and other key income-related issues.

Insurance – If you received health insurance through your employer, an early retirement could present you with a dilemma, especially if you're not quite old enough for Medicare. You might

hand sanitizer, air filters and staggered schedules.

Argyle ISD officials decided to proceed with the start of in-person classes, as did most local districts, despite guidance from Denton County Public Health to delay such moves until at least Sept. 8.

Pilot Point ISD went back to school Aug. 13. Aubrey and Krum schools have students heading back this week. Sanger ISD starts its school year Aug. 24, the same day the University of North Texas and Texas Woman’s University return.

Ponder ISD starts back Aug. 25. Denton and Lake

Dallas ISDs will hold up the rear, not beginning until Aug. 26.

SISD administrators asked parents to fill out the Learning Platform Commitment Survey. The survey ended Monday, August 10th at 11:59 p.m. 1,143 participated in the survey and 33% chose online, which represents 471 students. But, there were a lot of parents that had not completed the registration process.

If a parent did not fill out the survey, they can still choose between the two learning options. If you have filled out the survey, you are committed to the platform you chose.

Parents can call your child’s respective campus principal if you have any

questions or concerns. They have added a three-week grace period so parents can ensure they have made the right choice for their child, allowing them to switch from online learning to face-to-face after the first three weeks of school. Once this grace period has past, students may not switch from online learning to face-to-face learning except at the end of the 9-week grading periods.

“We have a great challenge ahead, but together we can and will be successful. I look forward to a wonderful school year and being able to serve your children,” said Dr. Tommy Hunter, Sanger ISD Superintendent.

Sanger ISD Dress and Grooming Code 2020-2021

The district's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:

APPROPRIATE ATTIRE	<p>Male students must wear clean clothing (shirt, slacks, shorts, trousers) that is not torn or damaged. Female students must wear clean clothing (dress, blouse, shirt, skirt, slacks, shorts) that is not torn or damaged. Jeans may have holes located below the fingertips when hands are placed at the side. If jeans are shredded above the fingertip length, undergarments or skin must not be showing.</p> <p>Pants must be worn with the waist at waist level, and shirts or blouses must be buttoned. All students must wear shoes and appropriate undergarments.</p> <p>Sweatshirts/jackets with hoods may be worn; however, the hoods may not be worn on the head in the school building.</p> <p>Leggings and yoga pants must be worn with a shirt, blouse or tunic that covers the backside, and front, must be below fingertip level. Mesh panels in yoga or athletic pants must be below fingertip level (when fingertips are placed at the side).</p> <p>Track shorts may be worn during physical education/athletic classes ONLY (6-12 grades).</p>
INAPPROPRIATE OR UNACCEPTABLE ATTIRE	<p>The following clothing and accessories are inappropriate attire for any student at school or school-related or sanctioned activity:</p> <p>Shorts, including skirts, or dresses shorter than the length of all fingertips when standing with arms at the side.</p> <p>Track shorts are prohibited (6-12 grades).</p> <p>Spandex shorts are prohibited.</p> <p>Pants worn below the natural waistline or sagging, bagging or extremely loose pants.</p> <p>Shirts or blouses that reveal undergarments or cleavage, midriff length tops that leave exposed skin, or halter tops.</p> <p>Exposed undergarments, including bra straps and boxer/briefs, or undergarments visible under clothing. Shirts that reveal skin around the waist when the student is sitting, bending or reaching.</p>

APPROPRIATE GROOMING	<p>Bedtime attire, pajamas with or without pockets, undershirts, or undergarments worn as outerwear, e.g., boxer shorts.</p> <p>Clothing made of any see-through material, fish net, or very loosely woven fabric, unless other acceptable clothing is worn underneath.</p> <p>Sleeveless shirts are not acceptable, e.g., tank tops.</p> <p>Shirts or blouses that reveal undergarments or cleavage, midriff length tops that leave exposed skin, halter tops, strapless (off the shoulder), spaghetti straps or racerback shirts are not permitted.</p> <p>Slippers or house shoes.</p> <p>Hair grooming products such as combs, picks or rollers worn in the hair are not acceptable.</p>
INAPPROPRIATE GROOMING	<p>All students will exemplify grooming standards that project a positive image for the student, school, and District. Hair must be clean and neatly groomed and worn in a style that does not cover the eyes or eyebrows.</p> <p>Male students' hair must be neatly trimmed and worn in a style above the eyebrows that exposes the earlobes and has a length not exceeding the bottom of the collar of a dress shirt or top of a crew-neck tee shirt.</p> <p>Male students must be free from facial hair. Sideburns may extend no lower than the bottom of the ear and must be trimmed in a straight line without flares at the bottom.</p> <p>The following hairstyles or colorings are inappropriate grooming for any student at school or a school related or sanctioned activity:</p> <p>Liberty spikes or other sculptured hairstyles.</p> <p>Neon or other hair colorings or bleaching, whether permanent or temporary, in shade or tone that the principal determines to be unnatural, such as, but not limited to, neon orange, neon pink, magenta, any shade of blue, any shade of green, violet, purple, white.</p> <p>Hair coloring, bleaching, highlighting for the purpose of creating extreme differences in color, shade, or tone between sections of individual strands of hair, hair extensions, weaves, or areas of hair on the head.</p> <p>Ponytails, mohawks, man buns, for male students.</p> <p>Patterns or designs shaved or cut into the hair, notched eyebrows, etc.</p>

CLOTHING WITH WORDS OR PICTURES	<p>Clothing worn at school or school-related or sanctioned activities may not display printed statements or pictures:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. That are vulgar or obscene; 2. That are related to or depict sexual activity; 3. That promotes hate or violence in general or are directed at any specific person or group of persons; or 4. That are related to or depict the use of drugs, alcohol, guns, ammunition, or tobacco.
JEWELRY, TATTOOS, BODY PIERCING	<p>Students may not wear any jewelry or similar artifacts that are obscene or distracting or that are likely to cause a disruption to the educational environment or may be used as a weapon.</p> <p>Students may not wear tongue piercings, facial jewelry (nose, lip, brow), or facial decorations (other than normal makeup).
