Amendment to Return To Learning

Pk-12th grade will wear a mask when entering, exiting, or transitioning in a building.

Pk-12th grade will wear a mask when riding on a school bus.

Pk - 2nd grade will be allowed to remove masks when in the classroom and social distancing is achieved.

3rd-12th grade will wear a mask at all times except when doing physical activities in P.E., at recess, or during lunch.

ADDITIONAL UPDATE TO THE AMENDED RETURN TO LEARNING PLAN CONCERNING FACE MASKS: In a classroom where social distancing is taking place, a student may replace the mask with a face shield. If they are working in small groups where social distancing is not taking place, masks are required. So shields are only allowed in classrooms where social distancing is available.








OBITUARIES... Jim Dale Lowimore







What Does an Unplanned Career **Financial** Transition Mean for You?

The COVID-19 pandemic has unsettled the country's employment picture for months and will likely continue to do so for a while. However, the nature and terminology of this disruption varies greatly among individuals – some have seen their jobs disappear, others have been "furloughed" and still others have been offered an early retirement. If you're

in this final group – those either offered, or feeling forced to accept, an early retirement, how should you respond?

Try to look at your situation holistically, rather than strictly in a shortterm manner. Consider these four areas:

does retirement really look like to you? Are you ready to fully retire or would you like to work part time? Are you confident that you can work somewhere else for a few years before retiring on your own terms? If you're not certain you can work elsewhere, how can you adjust your desired retirement lifestyle - what you planned to do, where you hoped to live, etc. – to meet your new reality?

Income – Just how financially affected you'll be from an early retirement depends on several factors: how much you've already saved and invested, whether you're married and have a working spouse, whether you've paid off your mort-

gage, and so on. In any case, though, you'll need to answer several questions, including these: Do I need to start taking withdrawals from my IRA and 401(k)? If so, how much can I afford to take out each year without running the risk of outliving Retirement - What my resources? Should I adjust my current investment mix? If I haven't yet started collecting Social Security, should I do so now, or can I afford to wait until my monthly payments will be bigger? Are there any other sources of income I can leverage? You may want to work with a financial professional to address these and other key income-related issues.

Insurance - If you received health insurance through your employer, an early retirement could present you with a dilemma, especially if you're not quite old enough for Medicare. You might

The district's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and

	s. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and ovided that they comply with the following:
APPROPRIATE ATTIRE	Male students must wear clean clothing (shirt, slacks, shorts, trousers) that is not torn or damaged. Female students must wear clean clothing (dress, blouse, shirt, skirt, slacks, shorts) that is not torn or damaged. Jeans may have holes located below the fingertips when hands are placed at the side. If jeans are shredded above the fingertip length, undergarments or skin must not be showing. Pants must be worn with the waist at waist level, and shirts or blouses must be buttoned. All students must wear shoes and appropriate undergarments. Sweatshirts/jackets with hoods may be worn; however, the hoods may not be worn on the head in the school building. Leggings and yoga pants must be worn with a shirt, blouse or tunic that covers the backside, and front, must be below fingertip level. Mesh panels in yoga or athletic pants must be below fingertip level (when fingertips are placed at the side).
	Track shorts may be worn during physical education/athletic classes ONLY (6-12 grades).
	The following clothing and accessories are inappropriate attire for any student at school or school-related or sanctioned activity:
	Shorts, including skirts, or dresses shorter than the length of all fingertips when standing with arms at the side.
	Track shorts are prohibited (6-12 grades).

If your child comes to school wearing clothes that violate the dress code or in any other way violates our dress and grooming standards, she or he may be given appropriate modest clothing or placed in in-school suspension until she or he is in compliance. We will make efforts to notify you as soon as possible, and if the student changes clothes or otherwise comes into compliance with the dress and grooming standards, she or he will return to regular classes immediately. 





eligible for COBRA, which provides ex-employees and their dependents the option of continued health insurance for potentially up to 36 months, but this coverage can be expensive. As an alternative, you might be able to negotiate an extended severance package, which could provide you with health insurance for several months. Or, you might be able to get on the health insurance plan of your working spouse.

Legacy –Many people want to take care of their family while they're alive – and leave something behind when they're gone. If you take an early retirement, you might lose your employer's group life insurance.

Of course, if this plan was not sufficient, you may have already supplemented it with your own policy, but, if you haven't, you may need to shop around for some coverage, particularly if you have children still at home. You also may want to take this opportunity to review your key financial accounts to make sure your beneficiary designations still accurately reflect your wishes.

Going through an unplanned career transition is certainly challenging. But looking closely at the four areas describe above, and making the appropriate moves, may help you reduce some of the stress and can put you in a better position to start the next phase of your life.
