How the Sanger ISD Bond will affect the elementary schools

The Sanger ISD Bond set for May 7 will bring some major changes throughout the entire school district. Most of the attention will likely be given to the high school and middle school changes. Next week this space will focus on those elements. The changes in the elementary grades are just as important. Butterfield Elementary is projected to surpass its functional capacity of students in Fall of 2022. In just a couple of years, it will surpass its maximum capacity. Without the changes proposed in this bond, Butterfield Elementary will be forced to utilize portable classrooms.

Instead of choosing the more expensive option of building a new elementary school, the volunteers on the committee decided to take the more conservative route and recommended an elementary level grade realignment, or reconfiguration. By moving all Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten classes to Chisholm Trail Elementary, space is freed up at Butterfield to manage the growth. Both Butterfield Elementary and Clear Creek Elementary will serve children in grades 1-5 with no changes to boundary lines.

Clear Creek Intermediate will receive a new addition with 18 classrooms, a driveway renovation, a larger kitchen and cafeteria, and renovation of the playground area. One major benefit of these changes will be an improved after school child pick-up process. A renovation of the administration spaces is included.

The roof will be replaced along with replacement of the fire alarm system. An important part of the new classroom addition is that a storm shelter will be included. This bond will provide a safe place for the students and staff during severe weather, and a controlled entry to keep our kids that much safer.

Butterfield Elementary will not undergo building expansion or renovation. This is the newest building in the district. The only changes at Butterfield will be reconfiguring to serve grades 1-5. This

Financial issues facing women business owners

As a business owner, you're always busy, so it's understandable if you've put off thinking about events that won't occur until far in the future – such as your retirement, the sale or transfer of your business and the settling of your estate. Nonetheless, it's a good idea to start planning now, while also recognizing the special challenges that women business owners face in these areas.

Essentially, you'll have four key issues to consider: Building assets – While you're working, you'll want to build as many financial assets as possible. a SEP-IRA or a SIMPLE IRA. A financial professional can help you choose an appropriate plan.

Planning an exit strategy – How you transition from your business can affect your estate plans, in terms of the assets you leave behind and which family members are connected to your exit strategy. To illustrate: You could choose to pass your business to an adult child or other close relative, but if you have no family members willing to take on this responsibility, you could transfer ownership through an employee buy-out, if you have employees, or you could sell the business outright to a third party. Whichever route you choose will need to be integrated into your overall retirement and estate plans.

Caregiving – As mentioned above, you might take some time off work to care for your children or aging parents. In fact, two of every three caregivers in the United States are women, according to the CDC. Being a caregiver can incur emotional and financial costs. To help avoid entangling your fi-

nances with those of the family members to whom you're providing care, you may want to consider creating a durable financial power of attorney, a legal document that gives you the authority to make financial decisions on behalf of someone who may be incapable of making them on their own. You'll want to address the possible need for this document well before it needs to be activated.

Creating estate-planning documents – You will need to work with a legal professional to create estate-planning arrangements such as a will and a living trust, relevant business-planning documents,

powers of attorney and health care directives. If your situation is complex enough, you also may need to bring in a trust company to manage the assets placed in a trust and oversee the eventual transfer of these assets to beneficiaries.

A lot goes into preparing for retirement, developing estate plans and keeping them current. So, start early and get the help you need from experienced professionals. The more thorough your planning, the more control you'll have over your future.

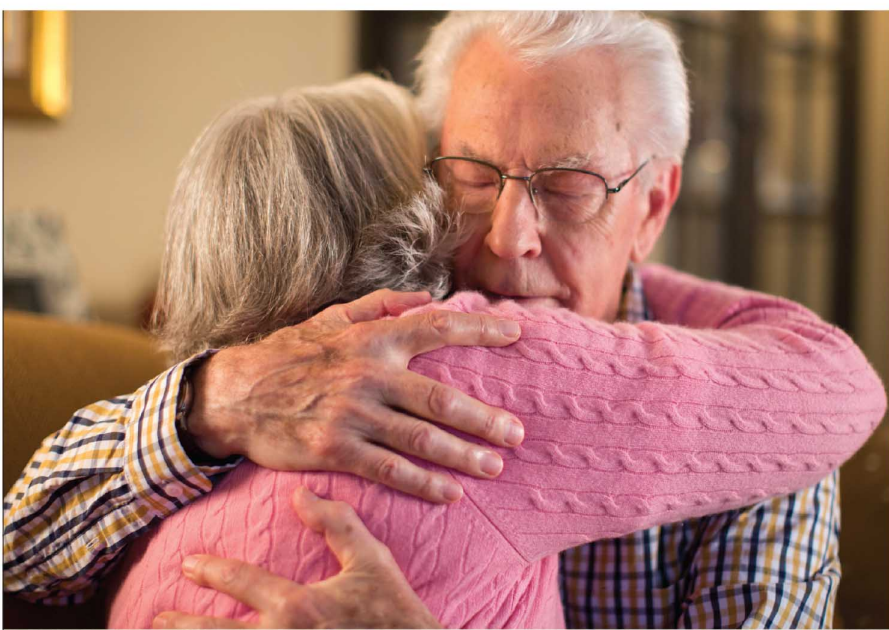

LETTER TO THE EDITOR...

Hello, my name is Victor Gann. Not only am I a graduate of SHS (1989), I have also been a business owner for almost 20 years here and have two daughters currently attending school here.

I was a bit of an oddball in school. There weren't many places for long hair guitar players then. Sanger was much smaller then and if you didn't do something with a ball, well, your opportunities were limited.

Even then there was always talk of when the growth would come, but it never seemed (to a kid)

a strong priority. I would hear often of how "one day" Dallas would push everything our way. That day is here.

Each one of our campuses fail state standards for the students we currently have. Now, this does sound more ominous than it is. This does not mean that the buildings are in despair and have become a hazard. State guidelines state that each student should have a certain amount of square feet available, we fail. That means we already have too many students for these buildings. So that is rea-

son number one that I support the bond. There is more growth coming. There are plans currently for over 5000 homes to come to Sanger, and the majority that are moving here are younger. So I would certainly expect many of these younger couples to plan or already have children.

Reason number two. With the growth we have already experienced plus the growth that is to come, we as a community should invest more into our children. That means not only giving the children of Sanger more room, but more opportunities. With growth comes growth. We now have a Culinary Arts program, an award winning band, an award winning theatre group, we even have a JV softball team. Our Ag program is probably bigger and stronger than ever...and there are many more things we now offer the students of Sanger. As growth continues, this growth will expect and demand that these programs be up to standards and for more programs to be available.

Reason number three is simple, the children of Sanger deserve these things. As a parent, both of our daughters are involved in athletics, cheer, band, and almost anything else they can be involved in. We encourage them to try it all, they only get one shot at this. Well, the kids at school who are involved in other activities typically have to carry around at least two bags everyday... why? Because we don't have the room available to make use of lockers. This may seem small, but imagine taking your ipad, binders, lunch, and athletic gear to every class... becomes an unneeded and distracting burden on them.

Finally, I do understand that some of our citizens have no opinion or a no opinion on this, that is fine. But I leave you with one more thing to think about. If this

bond does not pass what can be expected? We can expect the growth to continue and our schools to remain beyond capacity... that means portables. As a student, parent, or employee I sure would not expect this to build confidence in our district. I'm sure we would lose some of our district employees (and we have some GREAT ones here). Then in turn more students would leave Sanger for other districts. Then I think it's within reason to expect the quality/types of companies looking to invest in Sanger to possibly change their direction. If I owned a multi-million dollar company I would certainly look at how the community supports itself as well as what is the district producing? Take a look at some of the local towns that were recently in our position, some of those have had great success. All parties worked together, which in turn brings in more tax base, which in turn means upgrades for the town as well. It's up to us, the citizens of Sanger for this. I don't enjoy telling anyone, "Yes, your taxes will go up", mine will rise too, but this would be a great use of our taxes.
