How the Sanger ISD Bond will affect the elementary schools

The Sanger ISD Bond set for May 7 will bring some major changes throughout the entire school district. Most of the attention will likely be given to the high school and middle school changes. Next week this space will focus on those elements. The changes in the elementary grades are just as important. Butterfield Elementary is projected to surpass its functional capacity of students in Fall of 2022. In just a couple of years, it will surpass its maximum capacity. Without the changes proposed in this bond, Butterfield Elementary will be forced to utilize portable classrooms.


Instead of choosing the more expensive option of building a new elementary school, the volunteers on the committee decided to take the more conservative route and recommended an elementary level grade realignment, or reconfiguration. By moving all Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten classes to Chisholm Trail Elementary, space is freed up at Butterfield to manage the growth. Both Butterfield Elementary and Clear Creek Elementary will serve children in grades 1-5 with no changes to boundary lines.

Clear Creek Intermediate will receive a new addition with 18 classrooms, a driveway renovation, a larger kitchen and cafeteria, and renovation of the playground area. One major benefit of these changes will be an improved after school child pick-up process. A renovation of the administration spaces is included.

The roof will be replaced along with replacement of the fire alarm system. An important part of the new classroom addition is that a storm shelter will be included. This bond will provide a safe place for the students and staff during severe weather, and a controlled entry to keep our kids that much safer.

Butterfield Elementary will not undergo building expansion or renovation. This is the newest building in the district. The only changes at Butterfield will be reconfiguring to serve grades 1-5. This

Overdrive is probably the most well-known since it has been around for quite a while, and many libraries around the country offer the service. Its award-winning reading app, Libby, is available for download through the App Store and Google Play. We share this collection with other libraries in the North Texas Independent Digital Consortium, which has allowed us to provide more titles than we could afford to purchase alone. The disadvantage is that most items are limited to only one user at a time, so you may have to wait to check out the more popular titles.
