sales this week since most public firework shows were canceled due to COVID-19. It is illegal to set up fireworks in the city limits of Sanger. But, you can shoot them off outside of the city limits. And, the firework stand at 2845 View Road in Sanger (next to McClain's RV) has a pop site and for \$20 you can set off your fireworks, as of Wednesday, before the Sanger News press deadline. There isn't any Denton County burn restrictions, with all the recent rains. The owner of Precision Fireworks has five locations (Sanger, Krum, Era, Moutain Springs and Tioga). Sanger's location has the only pop site. He said that restrictions from the CO-VID 19 could shut down the site, but he's hoping not. "Things are changing day to day and minute to minute." But, you can set them off on private property in Denton County, outside the city limits. There are plenty of fireworks stands around Sanger to fill your needs this week.

## What is legal and where can I go to shoot off fireworks?

It is legal to discharge fireworks on your private property or on private property of another with the owner's permission in the unincorporated areas of Denton County. This rule does not supersede a city's ability to regulate the discharge of fireworks within 5,000 feet of their city limits.

## Municipalities and Lakes

Most cities have ordinances prohibiting the sale, possession and discharge of fireworks within their city limits. Some larger cities can enforce certain ordinances within their extra territorial jurisdiction (ETJ) and may include the possession and discharge of fireworks. If you reside with-

Possession and or discharge of fireworks on U.S. Corps of Engineer Property is illegal. This includes most parks and property adjoining Lake Lewisville and Lake Ray Roberts.

Always seek permission from landowners prior to discharging fireworks on private property.

## Prohibited Use of Fireworks

A person may not:
1. explode or ignite fireworks with-

in 600 feet of any church

hospital other than a veterinary

hospital asylum

licensed child care center

or a public or private primary or secondary school or institution of higher education unless the person receives authorization in writing from that organization;

2. sell at retail, explode or ignite fireworks within 100 feet of a place where flammable liquids or flammable compressed gasses are stored and dispensed;

3. explode or ignite fireworks within 100 feet of a place where fireworks are stored or sold;

4. ignite or discharge fireworks in or from a motor vehicle;

5. place ignited fireworks in, or throw ignited fireworks at, a motor vehicle;

6. conduct a public fireworks display that includes Fireworks 1.3G unless the person is a licensed pyrotechnic

# Gov. Greg Abbott orders Texas bars to close again and restaurants to reduce to 50% occupancy as coronavirus spreads

The moves, announced last Friday morning, represent Abbott's most dramatic action yet in response a surge in cases after he allowed businesses to reopen in the state.

Gov. Greg Abbott on Friday took his most drastic action yet to respond to the post-reopening coronavirus surge in Texas, shutting bars back down and scaling back restaurant capacity to 50%.

He also shut down river-rafting trips, which have been blamed for a swift rise in cases in Hays County, and banned outdoor gatherings of over 100 people unless local officials approve.

"At this time, it is clear that the rise in cases is largely driven by certain types of activities, including Texans congregating in bars," Abbott said in a news release. "The actions in this executive order are essential to our mission to swiftly contain this virus and protect public health."

Bars closed at noon Friday, and the reduction in restaurant capacity took effect Monday. Before Abbott's announcement Friday, bars were able to operate at 50% capacity and restaurants at 75% capacity.

As for outdoor gatherings, Abbott's decision Friday represents his second adjustment in that category this week. Abbott, last week gave local governments the choice to place restrictions on outdoor gatherings of over 100 people

after previously setting the threshold at over 500 people. Now outdoor gatherings of over 100 people are prohibited unless local officials explicitly approve of them. State officials have noted that case numbers in Texas began to increase around Memorial Day weekend, and have expressed worry about big public gatherings for Fourth of July.

Abbott's actions Friday were his first significant moves to reverse the reopening process that he has led since late April. He said Monday that shutting down the state again is a last resort, but the situation has been worsening quickly.

Abbott put Texas under what was effectively a stay-at-home order for most of April, shutting down all but businesses considered essential by the state. After letting that order expire at the end of April, he moved forward with a phased reopening of the state that was one of the earliest and quickest in the country. By early June, Abbott had permitted almost all business to open at at least 50% capacity.

But cases have climbed rapidly in recent weeks. There has also been rapid rise in the state's positivity rate, or the ratio of tests that come back positive. The rate, presented by the state as a seven-day average, has gone up to 11.76% — where it was at in mid-April and above the 10% threshold that Abbott has said would


Coach Davidson was loved and respected by all the runners in the SHS and SMS program. He encouraged anyone that liked to run to come out for the



## **Denton County Commissioners Court** encourages residents to wear face coverings

June 30, 2020 - Denton County Commissioners Court is encouraging residents to wear face coverings.

Denton County is currently experiencing an increasing number of positive laboratory-confirmed cases of COVID-19

"As the rate of positivity increases for COVID-19 in Denton County, we believe it is important that residents follow several basic health guidelines that will help keep everyone safer," said Denton County Judge Andy Eads.

During the meeting, Dr. Matt Richardson with Denton County Health Department recommended all community members utilize masks or cloth face coverings when in public and around individuals not in their house-

Face coverings help captures respiratory droplets of those with COVID-19 and keep them from spreading to others. Those without COVID-19 who wear face coverings will also reduce their risks for contracting the virus.

Other tips include:

- · Practicing social distancing to reduce the possibility of viral transmission. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention suggests at least six feet of separation between individuals.
- Cleaning and disinfecting commonly touched surfaces and frequent hand washing to reduce the risk of infection.

Denton County will soon launch a campaign, "#MasksMake\$ense," on social media to encourage the wearing of face coverings throughout the county.

Denton County Commissioners Court also extended the Disaster Declaration and Executive Order of Denton County Commissioners Court until 11:59 p.m. on June 30, 2020.

Denton County Commissioners also unanimously agreed to provide tax relief to homeowners at 1 percent of their homestead property's value but not less than \$5,000. The homestead exemption will be applicable to the current year's property tax bill, which will be sent out beginning




Early Voting for the primary runoffs began this week. The early voting location for Sanger is the Community Center at 101 Freese Drive and voting ends July 10.

cause alarm for the reopening process.

Abbott specifically cited the positivity rate in explaining his actions Friday.

"As I said from the start, if the positivity rate rose above 10%, the State of Texas would take further action to mitigate the spread of COVID-19," he said.

And later Friday, Abbott expressed regret for how he handled the reopening of bars in the first place.

'If I could go back and redo anything, it probably would have been to slow down the opening of bars, now seeing in the aftermath of how quickly the coronavirus spread in the bar setting," he said during an evening interview with KVIA in El Paso.

"We want this to be as limited in duration as possible. However, we can only slow the spread if everyone in Texas does their part," Abbott said. "Every Texan has a responsibility to themselves and their loved ones to wear a mask, wash their hands, stay six feet apart from


others in public, and stay home if they can."

Some local officials and business leaders also urged Abbott to do more, especially with regard to face masks.

The Texas Restaurant Association also reiterated its push for a statewide mandate on masks, removing the burden from restaurants to enforce policies themselves. Abbott previously banned counties and cities from enforcing mask policies on individuals, but later allowed them to fine businesses who didn't require them. This means restaurants can face fines for not enforcing the policies.

In an already bleeding industry, this puts restaurant employees in a dangerous and unfair situation, said Emily Williams Knight, president of the Texas Restaurant Association, during a virtual press conference Friday

'We're currently projecting 30% of our restaurants could close. We'll see what the next couple weeks bring, but that number could accelerate," she said. "I don't think the 50% [capacity limit] alone will be the driver. I think it's part of a much larger puzzle that restaurants are carrying the burden on right now — many are not going to make it."

# Sanger Library's Summer Reading Program is Underway! By Audrey Tolle



## SHS and SMS workouts

## resume July 6th

Nearlt two weeks ago, a parent of a student-athlete received a positive test result for COVID-19. However, this athlete had participated in summer conditioning on Sanger ISD athletic facilities and was in attendance June 17. For privacy reasons, SISD cannot communicate what groups this student participated in or the name of the student and their family. Because this student participated in strength and conditioning, inside the weight room, and inside the gyms any athlete who participated in these activities was potentially exposed despite the cleaning efforts.

In response to this test result, Sanger ISD took the recommended precautions of the Texas Education Agency and the local health authorities.

All athletic summer training was canceled for two weeks. All Sanger ISD athletic facilities, including fields, tennis courts, tracks, were closed to the public during this time as well. Coaches are resuming their sessions on July 6, 2020.

Beginning July 6, Sanger ISD will have the following precautions implemented:

- An electrostatic sanitation sprayer that uses a heavy-duty, quaternary cleaner, disinfectant, and sanitizer that remains on surfaces for 7-10 days will be sprayed on every surface in the facility daily.
- · Athletes and coaches are to observe social distancing protocols whenever possible.
- · Coaches and trainers will sanitize equipment in between athlete rotations.
- Hand sanitizer dispensers are available inside of the weight room, in addition to at the

entrance for locker rooms, coach's offices, training rooms, and weight rooms.

- Students' temperatures will be taken before entering the workout session daily.
- · In addition, students will only be allowed to enter
  - They have no symptoms
- They have received a negative COVID-19 test result if they've been tested.
  - If a student has been tested and not received their






