What is the testing process?

**TESTING IN SANGER** 

This is a drive-thru testing center and you will not have to exit your vehicle. At the testing station, a DCPH team member will perform the COVID-19 test by swabbing deep in your nose. The swab will take approximately 20 seconds to complete, and it may be uncomfortable.

Your swab will be packaged and sent to the lab.

#### Who is Eligible for Testing?

Denton County community members of all ages who meet eligibility criteria and are pre-registered can be tested. Those who are not pre-registered will not receive testing.

#### Eligibility includes:

Individuals with COVID-19 symptoms within the previous 7 days; Critical infrastructure workers with or without symptoms.

For a full listing of critical infrastructure sectors, please visit the Cybersecurity & Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) COVID-19 Response website.

Essential critical infrastructure workers must bring proof of employment, such as an employee ID or badge, to the testing center.

Symptoms include:

Fever

Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing

Fatigue

Chills Muscle pain

Headache

Sore throat

Loss of taste or smell Abdominal pain

Nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea

If you meet the eligibility criteria above, pre-register by calling 940.349.2585 Monday - Friday between 8AM and 5PM.

## MORE HISTORY LOST FOR SANGER

Batis home demolished for widening of FM 455

The home of Noah C. Batis was demolished, recently, on FM 455 near Keaton Road in Sanger. Mr. Batis was a family man, a Denton County commissioner, a Chisholm Trail herder, a livestock breeder of mules and horses, and he was a veterinarian to local farmers. Although he never had a degree to back it up, he had the knowledge and skills, and the local and area men trusted him to treat their livestock.

Noah was born October 4, 1860 in Jacksonville, Illinois and died in March 1950. He and Amanda E. Rhine Batis married and had 4 children; Bertha, Edward, Carl and Bessie. After wife, Amanda, died February 11, 1891 (and buried in the Krum cemetery), he married Laura L. Batis who gave birth to 5 more children; Walter, Guy, Beulah, Bonnie, and Noah. Laura died November 2, 1950 and is buried in Sanger Cemetery along with husband Noah who had passed away in March 1950.

Noah arrived in Sanger in the spring of 1889. He purchased 95 acres of fine land just on the edge of town, and built one of the largest and best accommodating barns in the country. Some of his finest animals were Keota Bob, McGregor, William




Evelyn Barbour November 6, 1935 - May 11, 2020



#### Sanger Library to Re-open with Limited Services

The Sanger Public Library has been offering curbside pickup of requested materials since May 11th and will soon begin the second phase of reintroducing services. On June 8th, the library will be open by appointment for checking out books and other materials, providing reference service, and assistance in faxing, photocopying, and mobile printing from patron's devices through the new Princh app. Appointments will be limited to 30 minutes and can be scheduled between the hours of 10:30 am-5:00 pm Monday-Thursday, 10:30 am-4:30 pm on Fridays and 10:30 am-1:30 pm on Saturdays by either calling the library or filling out the online form that will be available on the website at www.sangerlibrary.org.

The Minimum Standard Health Protocols for the reopening of libraries and museums in the Governor's Report to Open Texas currently requires the number of visitors allowed in the building be limited to 25% of the maximum capacity, which in the case of the Sanger library equals only 10 people. No "interactive functions" are to be used by visitors, and for this reason the library's public computers will not be available at this time.

The checklist also states that items coming into contact with visitors are to be sanitized, and employees are to maintain at least 6 feet of separation from individuals. It goes on to say, "If such distancing is not feasible, measures such as face covering, hand hygiene, cough etiquette, cleanliness, and sanitation should be practiced." Library staff members have been wearing face coverings when not at their desks or dedicated work areas and, though not required, the hope is that visitors will do so as well. The library's small physical space can make it more challenging to maintain 6 feet of separation, particularly in certain areas.

The following services and sections of the library will not be available in this phase of the reopening:

- Computer use
- Browsing in the children's section, the stacks (aisles of bookshelves), and sections in the back of the library.
  - Reserving the meeting room
  - Restrooms and water fountain
  - Seating other than designated chairs

We appreciate the community's patience as we, like many other libraries across the country, reopen in phases to better ensure the safety of both our patrons and staff. Appointments for curbside pickup will continue to be an option. We will also continue to offer virtual programs, including Summer Reading. The kick off will be on June 13th with a special concert by a popular local musician. Stay tuned for details!
